Loeffler, a wealthy Atlanta businesswoman, and Sens. Dianne Feinstein, D-Calif., and Jim Inhofe, R-Okla., turned over documents to investigators after political opponents and media reports called attention to the buying and selling of millions of dollars in stocks by the three senators shortly after the briefing.

A fourth senator, Republican Richard Burr of North Carolina, remains under investigation, the Wall Street Journal reported.

Loeffler has said the stock transactions were made by a third-party advisor without her input.

Last month, she liquidated her holdings in indi-

Loeffler Covington man arrested for murder

Victim remains unidentified, pending next of kin notification

COVINGTON, Ga. — A Covington man was arrested and charged with murder following an alleged shooting incident at the Super 8 Motel on Alcovy Road on Wednesday night.

According to the Covington Police Department, Terry Yates, 30, was taken into custody late Wednesday and is currently being held on murder charges for his alleged role in the incident.

The report states that CPD Patrol and CID

were called out to a shooting at the Super 8 Motel at ap-

proximately 9:20 p.m. Detectives then gathered evidence and interviewed witnesses throughout the night. The weapon used in the incident was found early Thursday morning in a field by Rocky Plains Road.

The CPD stated that the shooting victim has died from his injuries. The identification of the deceased victim will continue to be withheld until next of kin are

"This case is still under investigation." CPD Captain Ken Malcom said Friday morning. "We are awaiting an autopsy. We also have a number of witnesses to interview and reinterview. This is all that we can release at this time."



orders. Kemp signed an executive order Thursday allowing bars and nightclubs to reopen starting June 1 following nearly two months of remaining closed. In order to open their establishments, they must follow a strict set of guidelines, which includes limiting occupancy to 25 people — or 35% of the building's occupancy — and


While the social distancing and shelter-in-place recommendations have been successful in flattening the curve and

Since I made the change, my previous provider has flooded my mailbox with invitations for me to "come back." They are offering me faster speed, better service, and I think they promised to paint my garage. Honestly, if they had even answered the phone when I was their customer, I would have never

My first few weeks of quarantine were spent listening to "hold music." You know, that screechy noise they play between the insincere messages: "Your call is very important to us. Please remain on the line for the next available agent." After a few rounds of that, I hear a phone ringing. Success! I'm about to speak to a human. Nope. The next message informs me, "We are experiencing a high volume of calls. Wait times may be longer than usual. You may want to call back during the next leap

I know that my call is not that important to them. If it was, a real person would answer, and I wouldn't have to navigate the annoying phone tree. "For English, press one. Para español, oprima dos." That's not so bad. But it gets

"If you have questions about your warranty, press three. If you are checking on an order, press four. If you're going to San Francisco, press five. If you're planning to wear a flower in your hair, press six. If you've ever trimmed your weeds and found a bicycle, you might be a redneck. To speak with Jenny, call 867-5309."

Eventually, a live person speaks to me. I'm stunned. When he asks

how he can help, I have to think for a minute. Why DID I call? I can't remember. When I first called, the leaves were brown, and Bush was

I finally remember. "My printer stopped working," I said. "No problem," he responds cheerily. "I will need your name, address, the phone number it's registered under, the printer's model number and serial number, date and location of purchase, your mother's squash casserole recipe, and the nuclear code known only to the guy in the dark suit who travels with the president. And just like Jeopardy, you must respond in the form of a question."

Of course, I have the nuclear code in my wallet, but which phone number did I give them? I have no idea.

"One more thing," he says. "In case we get disconnected, I'll need a call-back number." I dutifully respond, and sure enough, moments later the line goes dead, and I hear silence. I never hear from him again. I'm too exhausted to climb back up that phone tree.

I am not quite sure how I expected to start this column when I wrote my last column in March. I laugh, because I wrote about being ten days into the shelter in place, and days seeming the same. Now, more than two months later, my days seem even more the same. Except now I measure the days by how much my newly planted vegetables grow and how much higher my newly-hatched chicks can jump out of their containment.

Yes, I am now a farmer, teacher, and professional chef as I pass on my knowledge to my sou-chefs--my children. Each night, I take turns with my children, letting them pick the menu and help cook dinner. We have cooked Thai food, Japanese hibachi, fondue, pizza from scratch, Vietnamese pho noodles and some run-of-the-mill meals like spaghetti, chili and tacos. I hope that is what my children remember from this time, the moments we spent together that we would have normally missed-playing tennis in the driveway, checking to see what plants have sprouted, and laying in their beds and reading stories from the Bibles they got for Easter.

Each week, the only day that is different than the day before is Sunday. We have not been perfect and there have been weeks, like on Mother's Day when my eight-year old was making fondue and after spending a couple hours in the kitchen getting everything ready and cleaned up from dinner, ten o'clock rolled around and we realized that we somehow did not celebrate mass. But spending time as a family, watching mass online has been the



one thing that has been mostconsistent, lv whether it is on a youtube channel on a laptop,

or on television watching the pope celebrate masses during Holy Week in an almost empty church or square. We started on the couch but we have now moved it outside under the tiki torches. For a moment last week, as I looked up at the colors of the setting sun in the sky, I marveled that I could worship Him in mass with His beauty all around me.

It made me think about whether I would want to go back to our slightly-dark church building early on a Sunday morning. Why not just worship God my own way? It is a question we all have to answer, as some things get back to normal and we have to choose what our new normal will be. Will a more-secluded way of life become normal, or a life that, while still interacting with people, may be from a little more afar? Times like this always make us think about what is important. Is God what we make of Him, conveniently fitting into what is most comfortable, or is He the ruler of our

We need the answer to that question in order to answer my original question. Will I choose to sit in the light of my tiki torches where it is convenient for me to celebrate mass in the safety of just my family? Or will I take the opportunity to celebrate with my church family when it is safe to do so? I think it will be the tiki torches as long as it is determined that to do otherwise could compromise the health of another human being. Or if one of my family members is sick, and we could cause someone else to get sick. But when it is safe to celebrate together, I want to hear a child whisper a little too loud when the mass is of course at its most quiet moment. I want to talk to my students and find out how they are doing, even if it is from six feet away and I can't give them a hug like I would normally do. And most importantly of all, I want to receive Jesus in the Eucharistic. God's grace is bigger than a pandemic and He has allowed us to stay close to Him as we receive spiritual communion at home. But how much more my soul longs to receive His body in the Eucharist when I have the chance to safely do that, and in the safety of the Church that He has provided to guide us in His truth. How I long for

Yes, things are guaranteed to look different, if in fact, we are still looking out for the vulnerable around us. And finding creative ways to connect with those in our church families and the community at large can be an adventure instead of a chore. But the call to rely on God, and then in turn, to share His love with those around us has never changed. May we be led by His Holy Spirit in the coming weeks and months so we can still be salt and light in the world.

Skrimp Shack

A Tasty Treat

COVINGTON, Ga. — Newton County welcomed in a new seafood restaurant Thursday morning as the Skrimp Shack held a ribbon cutting ceremony to officially open its Covington location.

Initially slated to open its doors April 2, the Skrimp Shack delayed the debut of its Covington franchise nearly two months due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The seafood chain is best known for its generous portion sizes at more affordable rates than the competition. Their specialties include a catfish nugget basket, the Skrimp n' Crab Meat Po Boy and homemade banana pudding, among many other delicious options. They also pride themselves on their homemade breader and sauces for every item on the menu.

"We are a fast casual, made-to-order seafood destination for those craving huge portions at affordable prices," Skrimp Shack co-founder Stacey Hartman said.

Stacey opened the chain's first location alongside her husband, Mitch Hartman, in Newport News, Va., in September 2011.

The couple had years of prior experience in the restaurant business before founding the Skrimp Shack. Mitch previously worked as a cook and was also a licensed vender selling fresh seafood out of a truck in a church parking lot. Stacey, meanwhile, had been waiting tables at a nearby Texas Roadhouse.

In 2011, the Hartmans decided they were going to team up and open a fresh seafood market in Newport News. However, after completing the necessary paperwork and signing the lease, they were informed 80% of their revenue must come from cooked food rather than fresh fish.

So, they adapted. Inadequately funded to operate as a full-time restaurant, Stacey and Mitch placed their faith in God and began saving up money for the equipment they needed.

By 2015, they were able to open their second franchise in Jefferson Avenue. Less than nine years after the first Skrimp Shack opened up, Covington became the 29th location for the chain, and the first in the state of Georgia.
