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Women released on bond after massage parlor raids

All three of the women arrested in last Friday's raid on local massage parlors are out of jail on bond, according to booking information provided by the Newton County Sheriff's Office.

Friday afternoon, Covington Police Department raided Lucky 7 Spa and Covington Spa in a four-month joint investigation with the Covington Fire Department, Homeland Security, the Georgia Secretary of State's Office and the Georgia Department of Revenue.

As a result of the raids, three women were taken into custody on various charges.

Kyong Cha Oliveira, 62, of Alpharetta, was arrested at the Lucky 7 Spa and charged with keeping a place of prostitution, prostitution

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Don Floyd, retired fire chief of the Covington Fire Department, announced plans to run for Covington City Council Post 3.

Originally from Porterdales, Floyd found his lifelong home in Newton County.

Floyd graduated from Newton County High School and went on to attend various fire service schools where he earned firefighter certifications. He attended the University of Georgia and obtained a certificate of public management in levels one, two and three. He also attended the Maryland Fire and Rescue Institute.

In 1968, Floyd enrolled into the United States Coast Guard as an electronic technician second class. He received an honorable discharge in 1972, and in the same year, he was hired as a full-time fireman for the Covington Fire Department. He continued his career as a fireman, having received multiple promotions over the years, until his retirement in 2012.

Before retirement, Floyd maintained his position as fire chief of the Covington Fire

Covington City Hall renovation starts this week

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Renovation of Covington City Hall and the Covington Planning & Zoning Department is officially underway after the Covington City Council approved the sole bid from Sunbelt Builders Monday evening. The renovation will convert the current council meeting room into office space and turn the current P&Z Department building into a meeting space and court services department.

Covington City Manager Leigh Anne Knight presented the stamped plans to the council during last week's work session. She said Sunbelt's original bid

on the project came in higher than expected, but because they were the only bidder on the project negotiations were allowed to get the project closer to the budget goal.

Coming in at \$458,576 for the entire renovation project, Knight said the

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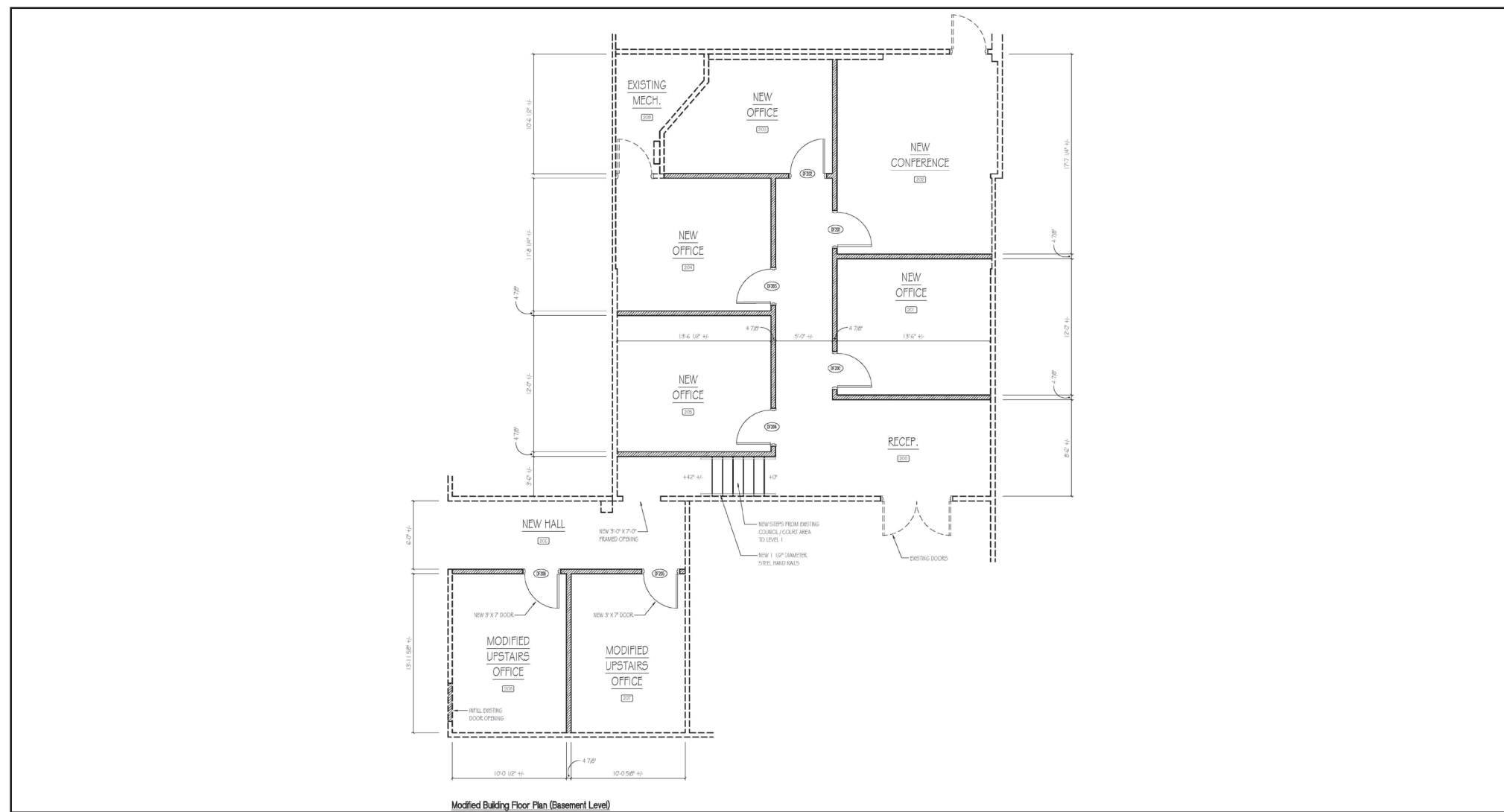
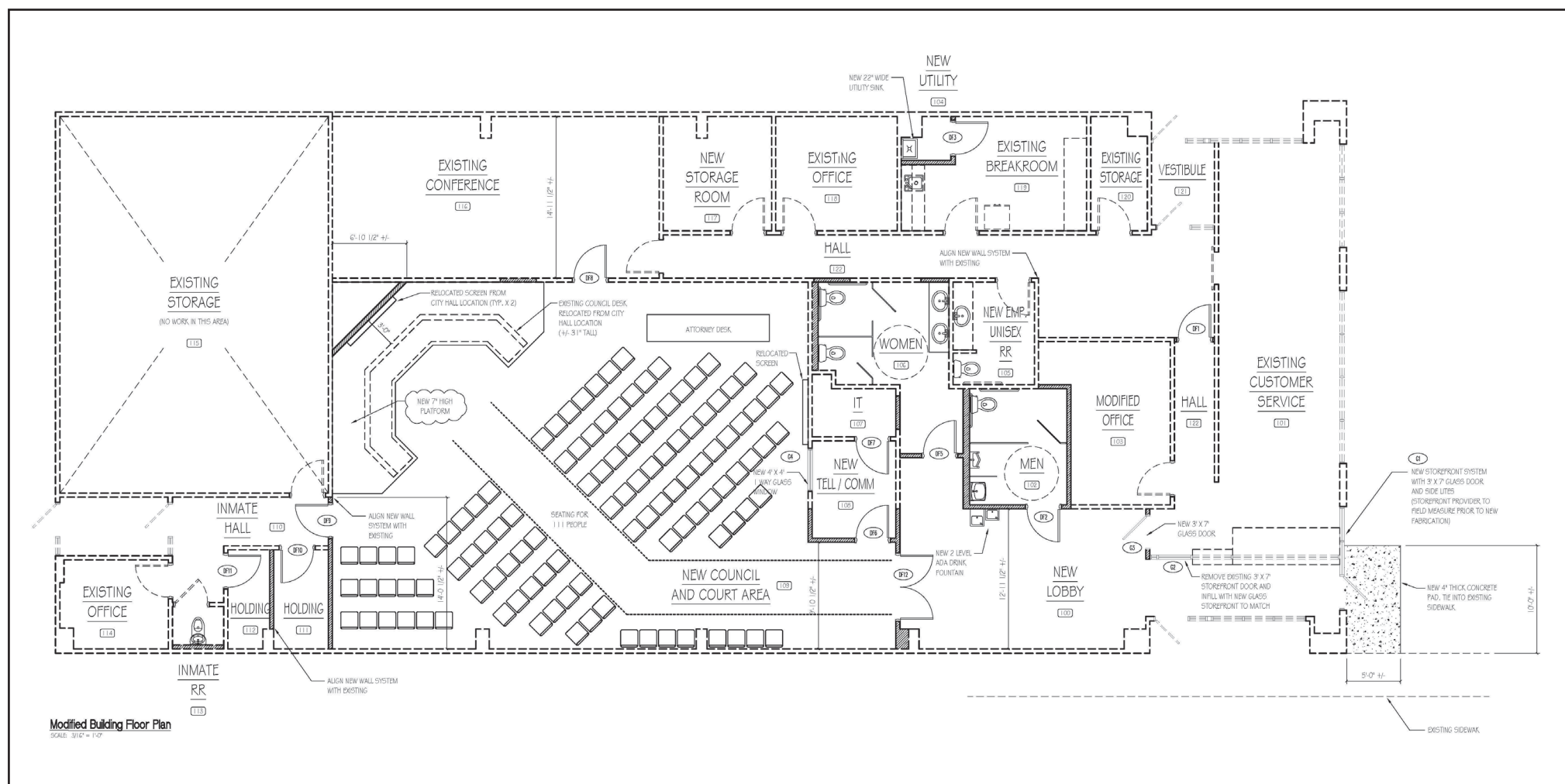

project will cost the city about \$100,000 more than what was originally budgeted because the original plan was for city staff to complete the renovation work.

"It's an election year," she said. "We have to let the

election board know by July where the election is going to be held. We can't be in the throgs of a renovation and there's no way we could get that amount of work done.

"Secondly, there was a lot of moving parts to this whole thing and so we just determined that we wanted to be above board and follow all the rules, so we just sent

it out for bid so we could have stamped plans and have exactly the other things that we ask other people to do with the major amount of renovation that we were anticipating doing."

Knight said the new council meeting and courtroom would add more than 100 seats, doubling its current capacity.

"I think people are going

to be happy that we did this and not a \$3 million brand new facility," Councilman Josh McKelvey said.

Covington Mayor said the biggest motivation for the renovation was the need for improvement of court facilities. Knight agreed and said the municipal court area - which is currently located inside the Covington Police Department - has

been undersized for multiple years.

"The police are moving and I don't want us to be stuck holding that building just because of municipal court three or four times a month," he said.

Knight said the renovation will start this week and should take three to four months to complete. Covington Public Relations

Manager Trey Sanders said as a result of the renovation, anyone wishing to speak with P&Z staff will need to go to the main City Hall building, as offices have been moved.

Councilman Anthony Henderson raised the question about the increased cost of the project. He was the only dissenting vote on the renovation.

They should have hired somebody famous." Thirty-five years later, I can safely say I blew that call. Oh, and the station manager never sought my advice again.

Truth be told, I could write a column every week about my track record of poor prognostication. I predict that would be hugely successful.

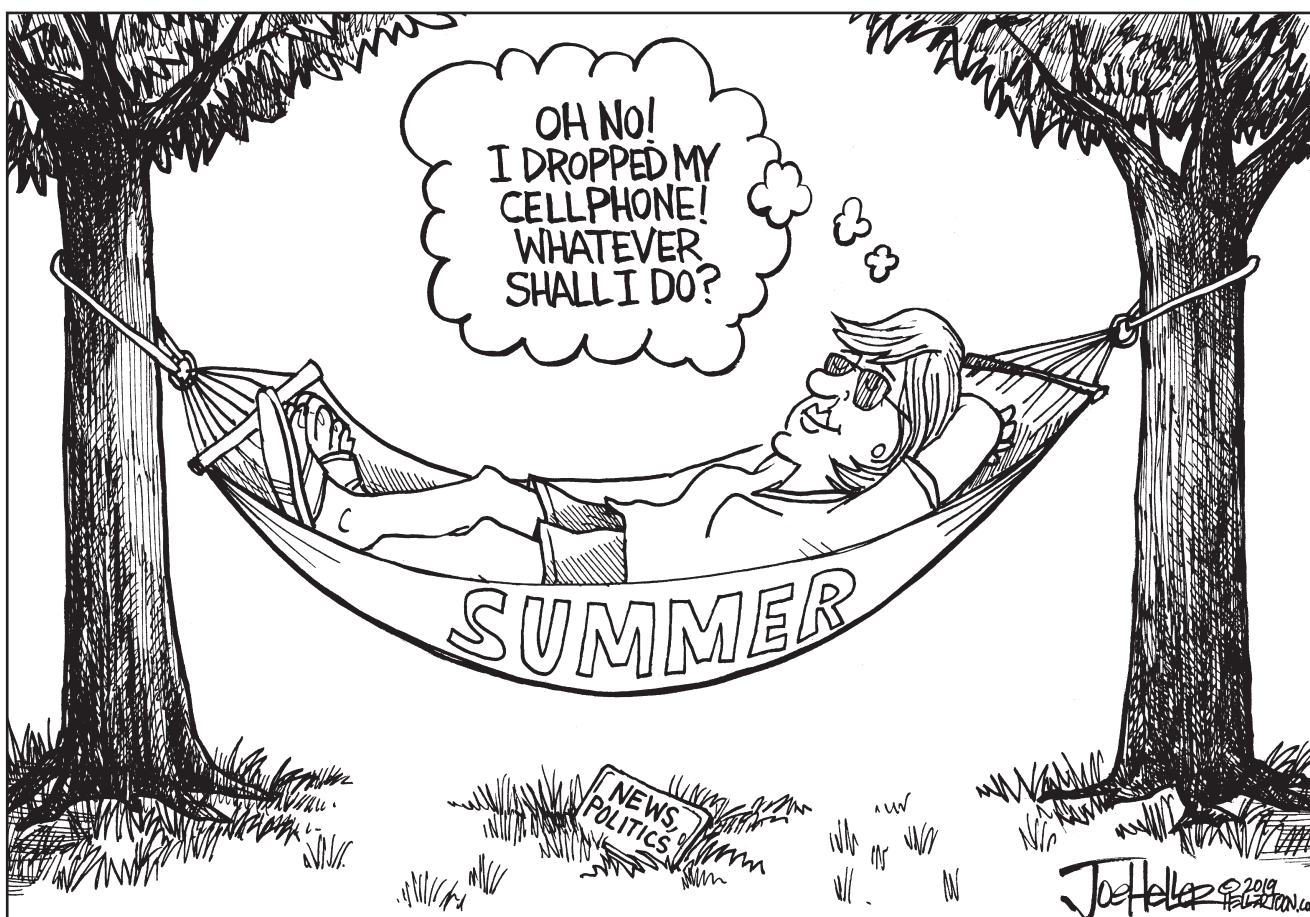

Consider the options before declawing

The New York Legislature recently passed a bill that makes declawing cats, for aesthetic or cosmetic reasons, illegal. As an avid advocate of keeping a cat's claws where they belong, no matter how pesky they can get, it makes me happy to know that we, as a country, are moving in the right direction.

My two cats, Xena and Grimm, both have their claws; however, I am not a stranger to declawing.

My 18-year-old cat, Smokey, was declawed in the early 2000s. There are still moments where she uses her scratching post, which is not abnormal behavior for declawed cats. The American Veterinary Medical Association stated that "59 and 78% of declawed cats will continue to exhibit scratching behavior with a normal appearance." It is bothersome to know

this behavior is common among declawed cats.

Not only do some declawed cats exhibit scratching behavior in later years, but they can also experience "debilitating arthritis in their backs and shoulders," according to PAWS, a non-profit that educates people on how to make a better world for animals.

I understand that declawing a cat may be required for medical reasons, such as an infection. The New York bill addresses situations where declawing is medically required -- it is

labeled as "therapeutic purpose."

A cat must have "an existing or recurring illness, infection, disease, injury or abnormal condition in the claw that compromises the cat's health" for declawing to be considered a therapeutic purpose, according to the bill. "Therapeutic purpose does not include cosmetic or aesthetic reasons or reasons of convenience in keeping or handling the cat."

In such cases, a local veterinarian can help the pet owner decide on the best medical option.

Declawing should only be considered for medical reasons, not for cosmetic or aesthetic reasons.

I understand the struggle of dealing with a cat that loves scratching the couch. Grimm once enjoyed using my couch as a scratching post, but he has since been

trained to use a proper scratching post for his clawing needs. I trained him by placing his scratching post near the area of the couch where he was scratching, and I would spray the post with catnip. I never once thought about declawing him, especially after seeing the effects declawing had on my older cat.

There are other alternatives if the cat cannot be trained to use a scratching post, such as kitty caps or regularly trimming the cat's nails.

Declawing is a permanent procedure with long-lasting effects. I advise all cat owners to educate themselves about declawing before taking the procedure into consideration.

Dove hunters: Season changes for 2019-20

Planning ahead for dove season? The 2019-20 migratory bird season hunting dates and regulations, which includes doves, were recently approved by the Board of Natural Resources.

Doves are a federally regulated migratory bird. As such, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service annually establishes a framework (opening and closing dates, maximum season length, and maximum bag limits) within which the states must set their seasons. These frameworks are developed with input of state wildlife agencies, and are informed using biological population, harvest, and habitat data. Recent framework changes

to the maximum closing date for doves allows Georgia to adjust its dove season responsive to public desires.

“For years our dove hunters have expressed a desire to end the dove season later,” John Bowers, chief of the game management section of the wildlife resources division, said. “The recent framework change allows us to provide dove hunting opportunity until January 31, and our dove season provides the maximum opportunity allowed.”

Dove season hunting dates are Sept. 7-30, Nov. 23-Dec. 1, and Dec. 6-Jan. 31, 2020. A complete summary of migratory bird hunting season dates and bag limits is online at www.georgiawildlife.com/hunting/regulations.

State license fees help support wildlife conservation in Georgia. The state receives federal funds from the Wildlife and Sport Fish Restoration program, based on a number of factors, including the number of paid sporting licenses. In Georgia, these funds are approximately \$14 million a year and have helped restore habitat and improve wildlife populations, expand public dove hunting opportunity and improve hunter access. Nesting eagles resilient, DNR survey shows

Bald eagle nesting stayed strong in Georgia this season despite a fall hurricane and heavy winter rains, according to the Georgia Department of Natural Resources’ annual survey.

Checking by helicopter in January and March, survey leader Dr. Bob Sargent counted 160 eagle nest territories in the six coastal counties and a western span of Georgia framed roughly by interstates 20 and 75 and the Alabama and Florida state lines. Add eight nests monitored by volunteers or DNR staff and the results included 168 nests and an estimated 195 young fledged. That’s about 1.2 fledglings per nest, slightly below the long-term average.

But Sargent said that considering the number of nests he usually finds in north Georgia during the every-other-year surveys of that area, it’s likely the state had more than 200 bald eagle nests for the fifth straight year.

That means the resurgent raptor and national bird overcame Hurricane Michael slamming southwest Georgia and stronger than normal rainfall in the region. Michael destroyed 14 nests in October. Excessive rain that fall and winter likely postponed mating and nesting by raising water levels and reducing the eagles’ ability to snag fish, their favored prey, according to Sargent, a program manager with DNR’s Wildlife Conservation Section.

“If fishing success rates are low, eagles have been known to delay their nesting cycle,” he said, adding that an especially rainy nesting season can also undercut hatching rates and the survival of nestlings.

DNR surveys bald eagle nesting to monitor the status of the state and federally protected species, which is also a priority in Georgia’s State Wildlife Action Plan, a guiding strategy to conserve native animals, plants and habitats. But largely because of the eagles’ sustained recovery, in 2018 Sargent switched from flying the entire state each year to checking coastal counties annually – they have the most nests – and half of the state every other year.

The change followed three straight years of 200-plus occupied nest territories and came only 11 years after Georgia’s nest total topped 100. Almost 30 years ago, the Southeastern recovery plan for bald eagles set a goal of 20 nests for the state. DNR documented a state-record 218 in 2017, the most recent statewide survey.

Many factors have fueled the bald eagle’s recovery: a U.S. ban on DDT use in

Survey Insights

While the 2019 bald eagle nest survey covered the six coastal counties and much of southwestern Georgia, eight nests in areas not usually checked also were reported and monitored by volunteers and DNR staff. The totals:

- **Six coastal counties** (including barrier islands): 74 occupied nest territories, with 62 fledging at least one eaglet (84 percent success rate; above average) and 88 young fledged (1.2 per occupied territory; average). New occupied nest territories: five.

- **Western Georgia** (Florida line to the south, I-75 to the east, I-20 to the north, Alabama line to the west): 86 occupied nest territories, with 59 fledging at least one eaglet (69 percent success; below average) and 95 young fledged (1.1 per occupied territory; below average). New occupied nest territories: eight.

- **Totals** (including data from volunteer and staff monitors, a few nests east of I-75): 168 occupied nest territories, with 127 fledging at least one eaglet (76 percent success rate; average) and 195 young fledged (1.2 per occupied territory; average).

- **Notes:** Hurricane Michael destroyed 14 nest trees or nests, all in Seminole and Decatur counties. In 12 of the 14 cases, 60-70 percent of trees in the surrounding forest were leveled. Only one new nest was found in this region. Michael substantially reduced the availability of suitable nest trees, likely meaning many eagle pairs that nested in the region when it was last surveyed in 2017 did not nest there this year.

Also, during the March survey flights only two coastal nests checked had an eagle still incubating eggs. Yet in southwest Georgia adults were incubating eggs on 12 nests monitored, an unusually high percentage so late in the nesting season. Habitat damage from the hurricane combined with much higher than average rainfall October-January likely contributed to delays in mating and nesting activities. High water levels, which increase flow rates, add turbidity and disperse fish, can also reduce eagle fishing success rates, delaying the nesting cycle. A rainy nesting season can increase mortality of egg embryos (and nestlings), as well. The result: Eagles can be incubating non-viable eggs a week or more after they normally would have hatched. At seven of the 12 southwest Georgia nests where adults were still incubating eggs this March, in 2017 the eagles had been incubating eggs at the nests 40 days earlier.

1972, habitat improvements after enactment of the federal Clean Water and Clean Air acts, protection through the Endangered Species Act, increased public awareness, restoration of local populations through release programs, and forest regrowth.

Yet while on the rebound, eagles still face threats. Those threats vary from avian vacuolar myelinopathy, a disease primarily affecting coots and the eagles that prey on them, to being shot by people and hit by cars.

DNR’s Wildlife Conservation Section monitors eagle nesting through aerial surveys in January and again in spring. The initial flights are focused on finding active nests: those with eggs, eaglets, an adult in an incubating posture or evidence that eagles have been prepping the nest for use. The second round of surveys is aimed at determining the reproductive outcome of those nests and checking recent reports of new nests.

The public is encouraged to report eagle nests via www.georgiawildlife.com/bald-eagle, (478) 994-1438 or bob.sargent@dnr.ga.gov. One tip: Osprey nests are sometimes confused with eagles’. If unsure, check out the nesting details in the profiles for both species at.

DNR works with landown-

ers to help protect bald eagle nests on private property. Although de-listed from the federal Endangered Species Act in 2007, eagles are protected by the Bald and Golden Eagle Protection Act, the Migratory Bird Treaty Act, and state law. In Georgia, the species is state-listed as threatened.

The Wildlife Conservation Section’s mission is to conserve eagles and other Georgia wildlife not legally fished for or hunted, as well as rare plants and natural habitats. The agency depends primarily on fundraisers, grants and contributions to the Georgia Nongame Wildlife Conservation Fund. That makes public support critical.

DNR offers help for landowners frustrated by flightless geese

The Canada goose lives in a variety of habitats, often in locations that are in close proximity to people, such as suburban neighborhood ponds, office complexes, parks, and other developed areas. This can become a frustration factor for landowners when geese begin to molt in the summer, according to the Georgia Department of Natural Resources’ Wildlife Resources Division.

“Each summer, in late June and early July, complaints about geese tends to go up,” says WRD State Waterfowl Biologist Greg Balkcom. “This uptick in complaints goes hand-in-hand with the fact that geese go through a molting process in summer, during which they lose their flight feathers and are in the process of growing new ones.”

What can you do if you have goose problems? During most times of the year, geese can be scared away with the use of harassment techniques. But, because geese cannot fly during the molt, these techniques may not work. During the molting season, WRD personnel encourage affected landowners and homeowners to be patient. The new feathers will soon grow in, and the geese will regain their ability to fly and will likely move on.

However, if geese continue to cause problems, here are a few tips to try and reduce the trouble:

- **Harassment:** Landowners who don’t want geese on their property can first try a variety of harassment techniques, including chemical repellents, mylar balloons, wire/string barriers, and noise makers. These methods are proven to help reduce goose problems. However, they require consistency from the prop-



erty owner and are not always 100% effective. More information can be found at www.georgiawildlife.com/nuisancewildlife (scroll down and click on “Canada Geese”).

- **Relocation or Lethal Methods:** Homeowners who want to reduce or eliminate the goose population on their property can obtain a permit from their local WRD Game Management office (www.georgiawildlife.com/about/contact). This permit allows them to have geese captured and relocated to a suitable area or allows them to legally and lethally remove the animals. The removal can be done by the homeowner or by a licensed nuisance wildlife trapper (list found at www.georgiawildlife.com/nuisancewildlife).

It is important to remember that Canada geese are a protected species under state and federal law. It is illegal to hunt, kill, sell, purchase or possess Canada geese except according to Georgia’s migratory bird regulations.

Covington man arrested for selling stolen cloned vehicle

A Covington man has been arrested for attempting to sell a stolen cloned vehicle.

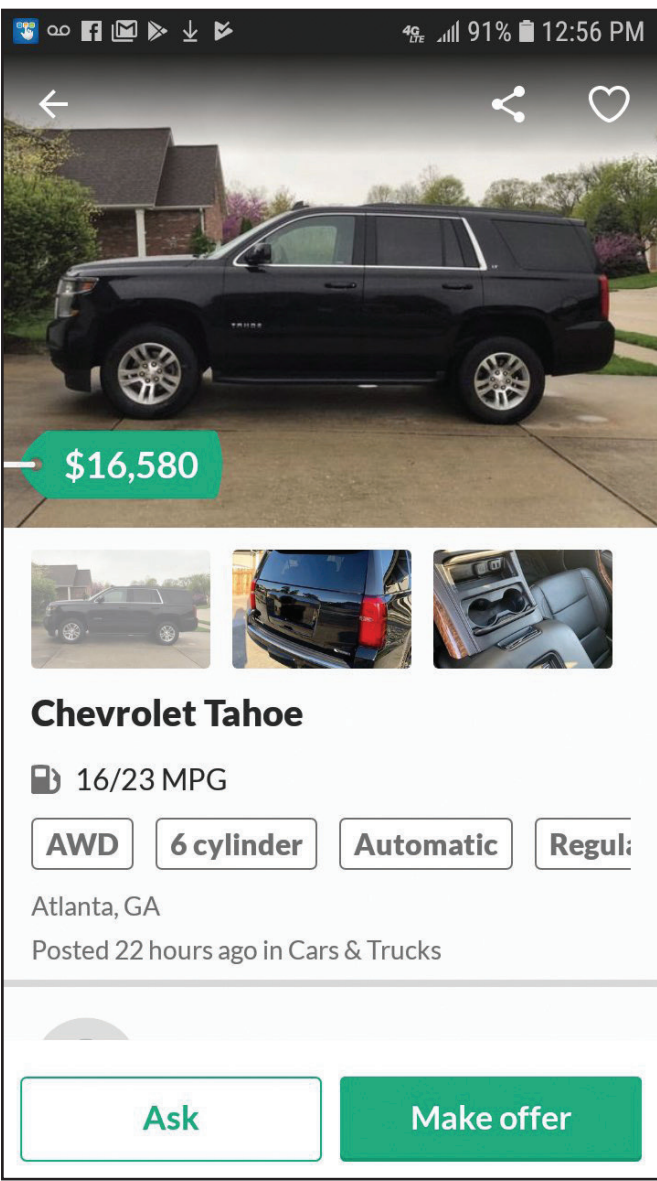
On Thursday, June 20, detectives assigned to the Motor Vehicle Theft Unit and officers assigned to the South Precinct arrested Miles Nimmons, 21, and charged him with theft by receiving stolen property, altered VIN and criminal attempt to commit a felony. He was booked into the Gwinnett County Jail and bonded out yesterday.

On Wednesday, June 19, a Lilburn man purchased a vehicle through OfferUp. When he tried to register the vehicle, he learned that it was stolen. The seller gave him a fraudulent title, and a fictitious VIN was covering up the true VIN behind the windshield.

On June 20, the original victim found another listing by the same seller who he purchased the vehicle from. The new listing showed a 2016 black Chevrolet Tahoe for sale for \$16,580. This price is well below fair market value, and so he contacted GCPD.

The Motor Vehicle Theft Unit contacted the seller and made an offer to purchase the vehicle in the parking lot of 1825 Rockbridge Road in unincorporated Stone Mountain. Shortly after 1 p.m., a man arrived at the meeting place driving the black Chevrolet Tahoe. Officers conducted a felony stop on the vehicle, and Miles Nimmons was placed under arrest.

Once the true VIN was recovered, the detectives learned about the history of the vehicle. It was reported stolen in Miami, Florida, May 4. The vehicle belonged to Enterprise Rental and was obtained through fraud. The suspect was not the same person who sold the original victim his vehicle the day prior.



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JJ Holloman removed from UGA football team following assault allegations

According to Georgia Football Coach Kirby Smart, University of Georgia wide receiver and former Newton High standout JJ Holloman has been dismissed from the football team after an investigation into a 2018 assault was launched earlier this month.

"Jeremiah Holloman no longer represents the University of Georgia football program," Coach Kirby Smart said in a statement to The Covington News. "We expect every member of our team to uphold the highest standards and values of the University of Georgia and Georgia football. It is disappointing when this does not happen."

According to a UGA Police Department incident report, a female victim came to the police department Sunday, June 2 to report an assault that occurred around 4 a.m. April 22, 2018.

The victim, reported arguing with Holloman after the 2018 G-Day Game. She then called Holloman's brother to pick her up from his dorm room located in Rooker Hall.

While waiting for Holloman's brother to arrive, the victim reported Holloman began to choke her.

"(The victim) stated that (the brother) walked in at this point and pulled the suspect (Holloman) off her," according to the report. "(The victim) stated she got behind (the brother) for protection. (The victim) stated the suspect (Holloman) then reached over (the brother) and punched her in the face."

The victim went to Piedmont Athens Regional Medical Center immediately after the incident and received six stitches.

"(The victim) stated she told doctors at the hospital that she received her injuries from falling in the shower," according to the report.

Medical records confirm the victim's account and also indicate "the doctors observed three abrasions on (the victim's) neck, which she advised them she sustained those abrasions during a basketball game and they were old," according to the report.

UGAPD also questioned Holloman about the incident. He admitted to hitting the victim during an argument.

"Jeremiah (Holloman) was rubbing his face in his hands and then looked up and said 'Yeah, after she started hitting me, I hit her back,'" Investigator Will Graham reported. "Jeremiah (Holloman) said the scratches or whatever was on her neck happened during sex."

Holloman described hitting the victim as "a quick jab" with his right hand.

The victim reported cutting off ties with Holloman, stating "she never looked at him the same after the incident."

Holloman, however, told UGAPD the victim had contacted him prior to filing the report. Holloman said the victim said "she was upset about him dating someone else that attends the same school as her." He added that she sent "threatening text messages saying that 'she would have someone get him.'"

The victim denied sending such messages.

Holloman's brother never responded to UGAPD's attempts to contact him about the investigation.

The victim wished to not pursue the case criminally, according to the report. The report was forwarded to the UGA Student Conduct office and the Office of Equal Opportunity.

Holloman committed and signed to UGA in December 2016 as a 4-star wide receiver prospect.

The 6-foot-2, 200-pound wide-out burst on the scene last year as a sophomore, catching 24 passes for 418 yards and five touchdown receptions. After a strong spring game showing, along with fellow Covington product Eric Stokes, Holloman was poised for a significant increase in playing time for the 2019 season.

Holloman finished his career at Newton with a team-leading 31 catches for 513 yards and seven touchdowns. He did not immediately respond to attempts to reach him for comment.

The Eastside Eagles made an undefeated 12-0 season in 2018 look easy, as they dominated the local football scene's headlines with a historic year.

Having a season like the one it had last year placed a sizable target on Eastside's back, as one Eagles coach put it.

Truthfully, there is no offseason for any team in Newton County -- or Georgia for that matter -- right now, but especially for the team that has to prove that 2018 was no fluke and that it was everything it presented itself to be. Eastside will be spending the majority of the rest of the summer painstakingly preparing for their encore year.

Beginning on Monday however, coach

Troy Hoff's Eagles took a moment to have a little downtime on the field by hosting a three-day training camp for kids in the community. Kids of all ages were able to work out with all of the Eagles coaching staff and some of the players.

Some of the kids were siblings of current Eastside players, while some were trying football for the first time, and others just wanted a chance to work out with the players they cheer on in the stands on Friday nights.

For rising senior and team captain Colby Shivers, he understands what the camp means to the neighborhood and what his being there represents.

"They look up to us -- we're like their role models," Shivers said. "On Friday nights,

Alcovy's Adrian Robinson looking for 'strong' comeback season after injury

When Adrian and Andrae Robinson showed up on the Alcovy High School campus as an incoming freshman, there were scores of people, including coaches, who could easily rave about the talent of the Robinson twins.

As time has gone and Alcovy has struggled on the football field, both Robinson brothers have shown

ample flashes to corroborate people's assessment of their giftedness. But sometimes, when a team isn't producing in the win column, it can be difficult for even the most obvious standout players to grab that coveted recruiting attention.

Add to that the fact that both brothers have battled injuries throughout their high school careers, and it wouldn't be a stretch to call their high school careers a

bit frustrating.

Adrian, for example, missed most of 2018 with a broken collarbone -- an injury sustained from a hit from teammate Demetrius Thrower (who recently got his first college offer, by the way, from Lawrence University).

The last time he saw the field in meaningful action was his 2017 sophomore season when he showed

they're out there watching us, cheering us on, and I'm sure we mean a lot to them. They just look up to us, because they think we're like the superheroes of the town really, and they just love watching us."

The seriousness of preparing for a year with so much on the line was traded in for some light-hearted fun with Eastside coaches and players who were seemingly having more fun than the kids in attendance.

A contest for the best dance after a completed drill in coach Trey Camps' offensive line, and coach Jarvis Brice harkening back to his playing days with his demonstration of the rip move gave the attending youth a chance to enjoy the company of the Eagles on a more personal level.

Laughs and jokes tossed back and forth between teammates were plentiful, and the kids never went without a smile on their faces for the entire first day of the camp.

It was a welcomed change of pace for Eastside players who spent Monday morning in a three-hour summer workout designed to get them in shape for the 2019 season.

Some players, as was their right, opted not to return that evening to help out with the camp. Yet players like Shivers, Austin King, Pierce Downs, Garrison King, Mark Jackson and starting quarterback Noah Cook showed up to lend a helping hand to the

camp, describing it as a way to help expand enjoyment of their football experience.

"[Camps like this] shoots [my confidence] through the roof, Shivers said. "I mean, I'm out here - I love making [the kids] smile. I love doing everything I can for them, because it just warms me up to feel that I'm making someone happy that's younger than me and looks up to me. And I just feel like I'm a big inspiration in their lives."

The Eagles in attendance did not find it a burden to come back out and support because they understood that the support they get from the community is earned, not given.

Consequently, giving that love back to the area is vital to the Eastside program.

"I think coach Hoff's vision of the program is that this is a program that the community can be proud of and supportive of," said defensive line coach Chris Edgar, new to the staff after spending the last three years as Alcovy's head football coach.

"And they had a great year last year, which I wasn't a part of. But going forward having some of the younger members of the Covington community being excited about coming and being a part of Eastside football is a great thing. They get to be out here with actual coaches. Coach [Erik] McMillan was a [Defensive] NFL Rookie of the Year. You just don't get that kind of opportunity."

"...Coach [Jay Cawthon] is a mad genius...that offense is fun to watch. So they get that hands-on experience with these great

coaches."

By introducing the kids to the Eastside way, there is also a possibility of creating a pipeline of talent that could result in some of them trying out for the team.

For example, the camp experience eight years ago is precisely what led incoming freshman offensive lineman, Levi Chaffin -- a former Indian Creek Middle standout -- to joining the team when he had the chance. Same thing could be said for sophomore linebacker Tucker Cleary, a player Hoff said has "been going to our camp since he could walk," and sophomore defensive end Christian Benson, the younger brother of now-UCF player Lamarius Benson.

"So [the players] have that pride in the program too, and they want that to continue on," Edgar said. "And so it's good for them just to be out here and kind of give back to the community as well, for sure."

Eastside has a lot on its plate for the next season, and it isn't taking that challenge lightly. The work the team, is prepared to put in from now until the season isn't easy by any means. There won't be many off days and chances to rest on their laurels.

However, when the lights are on Friday nights this fall, and Eastside is back to making it look easy, the kids from the camp will remember the time the Eagles took out for them.

And they'll remember the answer they gave Cook when he asked: "Y'all love football?"

It was a resounding, "yes."

Newton’s Glover chooses top five colleges

In about a year’s time, Diondre Glover has gone from an intriguing talent to a legitimate Division I college football prospect.

The 6-foot, 170-pound athlete from Newton High has had quite the journey since stepping foot onto campus three years ago as a freshman.

From potential dual-threat quarterback to wide receiver to now a two-way specialist who has the ability to dominate on both sides of the ball, Glover has seen his blip on the recruiting radar rise gradually.

Glover’s 2018 stats weren’t eye-popping, but his talent, athleticism and bravado — not to mention a big, gregarious personality — have shown up in ways that have coaxed college recruiters to come to Covington looking to see more from the senior.

Glover’s accumulated eight Division I offers, and on Monday night the budding Newton standout took to Twitter to whittle his list down to a top five. Of course, the recruiting game is fluid, and although much of his attention has come from a strong spring and summer, anyone who follows football recruiting knows that a stellar senior season in the fall could shift things around.

But here, Glover took some time with sports editor Gabriel Stovall to share some more in-depth thoughts on his recruitment and the five schools, in no particular ranking order, that are currently in the running for his services.

UNLV Runnin’ Rebels: From a mileage standpoint — 2,001 miles from Covington to be exact — is the school that’s farthest away from home for Glover. The Rebels finished 4-8 last year with a 2-6 mark in the Mountain West Conference under

fifth-year coach Tony Sanchez.

When They Offered: Tuesday June 3.

Glover’s Thoughts: “What I like about UNLV is that it’s in Las Vegas and on the strip, and I think that would definitely be a great and an exciting experience at a place I’ve never been before.”

Coastal Carolina Chanticleers: Coastal Carolina joined the FBS ranks in 2017 as a member of the Sun Belt Conference after a successful initial run in the FCS ranks. Jamey Chadwell will be entering his third season at the Conway, South Carolina school that finished 5-7 and 2-6 in 2018.

When They Offered: Sunday June 1

Glover’s Thoughts: “The campus is just in a beautiful place, and it’s by the beach. It doesn’t get any better than that. It’s just a really great environment.”

UNC-Charlotte 49ers: The youngest program to offer Glover, the 49ers began in 2013 and have had just two head coaches, the current program leader being Will Healy who came over from Austin Peay to be announced as Brad Lambert’s successor on December 5, 2018. Healy was the 2017 Eddie Robinson FCS Coach of the Year after helping Austin Peay to an 8-1 FCS record and 7-1 Ohio Valley Conference record in his second season guiding the otherwise moribund program. Charlotte competes in Conference USA and has compiled a 22-48 all-time record as it moves into its seventh season of FBS competition.

When They Offered: Thursday June 13

Glover’s Thoughts: “Now, Charlotte is where some of my family is, and it has a growing football program. I think it would be very cool to

be a part of what they’re doing.”

Mercer Bears: For now, the Macon school is the only in-state program to offer the Newton Rams’ senior. Don’t be surprised if that changes, though. The Bears are a FCS squad that plays in the Southern Conference, and with seventh-year coach Bobby Lamb at the helm, has built a respectable program. Mercer began playing NCAA football again in 2013 after a 72-year hiatus.

When They Offered: Friday June 6

Glover’s Thoughts: “Mercer is a great place that I’ve visited multiple

times already, and I like what they are building in their programs down there.”

Southeast Missouri State: SEMO was the first program to offer Glover. SEMO is also the school in his list that has arguably the deepest football tradition, albeit as a FCS program. The Redhawks are led by head coach Tom Matukewicz who will enter his sixth season in Cape Girardeau, Missouri.

When They Offered: Wednesday April 24

Glover’s Thoughts: “SEMO re-

cruits old school. They really build a bond with you. And really, that’s what I like about it the most.”

As for the timetable on his college decision, Glover isn’t interested in waiting around or dragging things out.

“I am committing very soon after I visit all the schools,” Glover said. “I’m visiting three this month and one in July, and I’ll be committing before the season starts.”

The Newton Rams open the 2019 season on August 23 against in-county rival Alcovy.

promise as a strong safety while compiling 37 tackles and breaking up three passes.

But anyone willing to talk about the 5-foot-10, 185-pound rising senior will tell you that there’s much more in Robinson than that smattering of sophomore season progress.

Count new Alcovy football coach Jason Dukes among the willing.

“I’m so proud of Adrian Robinson,” Dukes said. “I’m proud of the progress he’s making and the work he’s putting in to be better.”

Then Dukes described the play of Robinson’s off-season, so far, that best exemplifies Adrian’s drive to make his last year in high school count.

It happened during Alcovy’s 7-0 spring game win over Woodland last month. Adrian drifted out into the flat from his wideout posi-

tion and prepared to take a screen pass from quarterback MJ Stroud. A few seconds later, Adrian was making a bee line to the end zone for the Tigers’ only score.

But it wasn’t just the fact that he scored that caught Dukes’ attention. It was how Robinson did it.

“He caught that touchdown pass, and instead of dancing around, he just put his foot in the grass and took it straight to the house,” Dukes said. “He’s one of those guys who’s giving us all the things we’re looking for right now in terms of level of focus and commitment to getting better and not hurting themselves on the field, and I love it.”

So does Adrian Robinson.

As far as he’s concerned, the tunnel vision he displayed on that spring game trip to the end zone embodies the approach the Alcovy standout wants to take heading into his last high school hurrah.

“It felt great to score like

that, because it just showed how I just wanted to come back stronger than last year,” Robinson said. “Since last year I had a goal to make an all-state team, and I didn’t get to do it, so this year I said I’ve gotta come back stronger. I’ve gotta make all state this year and put myself in position to where I can come back stronger and come back faster. And I feel like all the tools I gained during my injury have propelled me to the next level.”

Yes, that’s right. As painful as both the injury and the lost junior season was, Robinson said it could prove to be the best thing to happen to him in his young football career.

“Mentally, I’m stronger,” he said. “I have a better IQ for the game. When you’re hurt, you know, you can’t do anything but watch film and develop an eye for the game. And that made me want to work harder so that I could get stronger and not get injured again. But also, the way I look at it, I got in those mental reps that, if I didn’t get injured, I may not

have taken those mental reps as seriously.”

Although Robinson seems poised to impress as one of Alcovy’s star defensive backs, he knows that Dukes and the new coaching staff will be looking to utilize his athleticism virtually any and everywhere he’s needed on the field.

Robinson doesn’t mind it though, because he feels as if every opportunity to get in a game — whether on offense, defense or special teams — just gives him

more chances to show people his potential. The fact that he gets the chance to do it with a fresh, new coaching staff only excites him the more.

“(Coach Dukes) has just brought such structure to us,” he said. “He’s brought a winning mentality from day one. He isn’t playing games with us. Coach Dukes sets the law and everybody abides by it. It’s just a different culture at Alcovy now.”

And it’s the kind of cul-

ture Robinson believes can help Alcovy break a winless streak in region play that dates back to October 2, 2015 — the last time the Tigers won a region game. Robinson says that’s all in the past, though.

“I feel like we’re gonna be good this year, like things are gonna be different,” he said. “I think we have what it takes to break that streak and even contend to be region champs. We’re definitely coming for that (region) title.”
