Car crashes into pond

COVINGTON, Ga. — Newton
County first responders, including
a dive team, recovered a vehicle
Thursday evening after it crashed
into a pond.

Nearby residents said they saw a
car speed “around the corner” and
hit a mailbox before crashing into
a pond off Bethany Road, about a
mile from the intersection at Cov-
ered Bridge Road in west Newton
County.

“We saw two girls hollering they
couldn’t swim, so I run and dove
into the water and helped them
out,” resident William Humphries
said.

Another resident said she imme-
diately called 911.

Shortly after the vehicle oc-
cupants were helped out of the
water, first responders arrived and
utilized a dive team to help King’s
Towing workers recover the vehi-
cle around 6:30 p.m.

After an investigation was con-
ducted, a Newton County Sheriff’s
Office spokesperson confirmed
Friday morning that the cause of
the incident was the driver simply
lost control of the vehicle.

The two females reportedly in-
volved in the incident were trans-
ported to a nearby hospital, wit-
nesses said. However, the NCSO
spokesperson said the women did
not suffer injuries.

DeAnna O’Brien revels in ‘little steps’ her students take toward independence

COVINGTON, Ga. —
DeAnna O’Brien says she
gets the greatest satisfac-
tion from her job when she
sees one of her special edu-
cation students functioning
independently outside the
walls of Eastside High
School.

“What it’s taught me is to
celebrate all the little steps
that make you into the per-
son that you are,” she said.

“We can all have these
huge, lofty goals that we all
shoot for five or 10 years
down the road. But we can-
not overlook all the little
things that got us there —
carrying your own lunch,
logging onto the computer
by yourself.

“The first day that they’re
able to walk to class by
themselves and you can
hang 10 feet back — it’s
amazing. There are 1,500
kids in this school — it’s
intimidating to walk down
the hall by yourself,” she
said.

O’Brien was named the
Newton County School
System’s 2022 Teacher of
the Year on Thursday, Sept.
30. She was chosen from
among three finalists who
also included fifth-grade
teacher Samantha Greco of
West Newton Elementary
School and sixth-grade
science teacher Clayton
Hammonds of Veterans
Memorial Middle School.

Teachers choose their
school’s Teacher of the
Year to represent them in
the competition for the
school system award.

In her speech after the
announcement of her
award Sept. 30, O’Brien

said “what touched me
the most” was that her
colleagues voting for her
meant they “noticed my
kids.”

O’Brien explained to
The Covington News that
other teachers voted for her
despite them having little
contact with her students
throughout the day.

“It’s certainly not inten-
tional, I don’t think,” she
said. “It’s just the way the
schedule is.”

O’Brien’s students re-
main with her and parapro-
fessionals Maria Hardeman
and Sande Jackson in a
self-contained classroom
most of the day. Other
teachers rarely see her five
students — who “can’t al-
ways voice for themselves”
and need someone else to
speak for them, she said.

“You see all these ac-
colades for grade point
averages and scholarship
winners and our athletes

who are being recognized
for the sporting goals they
have met,” said O’Brien,
who also is Eastside’s
swim team head coach.

“Ours (students) are
sometimes just not as
noticeable to the general
public, and even to the
school. But they’re just as
amazing. Their goals are
just not as widely celebrat-
ed,” she said.

Jarrard & Davis law firm it
has employed since 2015.

Kemps visits Texas border, calls for action on illegal immigration

Gov. Brian Kemp and nine other Republican governors have released a set of steps the Biden administration should take to combat the growing number of illegal immigrants flooding the nation's southern border.

The GOP governors unveiled their proposals Wednesday during a trip to McAllen, Texas.

"From gangs and human trafficking to deadly drugs and crime, hardworking Georgians experience the consequences of the border crisis every day," Kemp said. "This administration must act now."

Kemp and his Republican colleagues complained that President Joe Biden has yet to respond to their request last month for a meeting to talk about their concerns.

Among other things, the governors are calling on the president to finish securing the border, deploy more federal law enforcement officers to that region and resume the deportation of illegal immigrants with criminal records.

The governors pointed to an almost 500% increase this year in border apprehensions, including about 9,700 detainees with prior criminal convictions.

Rural state schools receive first round of improvement grants

Georgia's rural schools are about to receive a first round of funding initiatives designed to expand internet connectivity, develop new literacy skills and promote their workforce development, among other goals.

The state Board of Education voted Oct. 1 to approve a series of initiatives recommended by the new Georgia Department of Education's (GaDOE) Office

of Rural Education and Innovation.

Established in July, the office's goal is to address educational needs in rural schools and districts and provide a voice for the needs of rural Georgia in K-12 education policy.

The funding initiatives include:

- \$1.72 million to 43 school districts to expand broadband connectivity. Gov. Brian Kemp directed federal COVID-19 relief funds to double the bandwidth for every K-12 school. Most school districts have the capacity within their network equipment to utilize the additional bandwidth, but 43 districts will need to procure additional network equipment.

- \$4.93 million in grants to 57 school districts to outfit middle- and high-school career, technical, and agricultural education labs.

- More than \$18 million to 22 school districts to support districtwide literacy plans designed to improve student literacy learning, instruction, school climate, and development of community partnerships.

- \$10,000 grants to each of four school districts — Ben Hill County

Schools, Clay County Schools, Lumpkin County Schools, and Twiggs County Schools — to help them develop school-based health clinics.

tainment, food trucks, kids activities, and a children's business fair. There will also be a kid and pet costume contest.

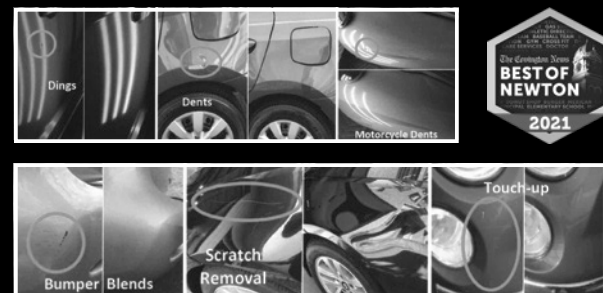

Fractious Republicans need to heed Johnny Isakson’s example

Class, like beauty, is in the eye of the beholder — hard to define but we know it when we see it. I thought about that as two events occurred in our state last week featuring prominent Republicans.



In Atlanta, hundreds of friends and supporters gathered to honor a quiet man who epitomizes class, former U.S. Senator and lifelong Republican Johnny Isakson. The event raised nearly \$1 million for the Isakson Initiative, a non-profit named for the senator who suffers from Parkinson’s. The new organization will be devoted to funding research on Parkinson’s, Alzheimer’s and other neurological diseases. In attendance were most all of the state’s major political lights — Republicans and Democrats. This was beyond partisan politics.

Two days earlier, former President Donald Trump flew into the Georgia National Fairgrounds in Perry and continued his relentless barrage of insults on Gov. Brian Kemp, (“A total disaster on election integrity”); Lt. Gov. Geoff Duncan (“Terrible”) and Secretary of State Brad Raffensperger, (“A very strange guy”) — all of whom he blames for costing him his reelection.

There is no question Trump has created a deep schism in the Republican Party that Johnny Isakson helped to build. My mail over the past year has taken two forms. Many longtime conservative voters say they are tired of Trump’s hyperbole and personal insults and would not vote for him next time, assuming he runs. And then there are those who tell me they will visit out next year’s election rather than vote to reelect Brian Kemp. How this helps the Republican’s chances in Georgia in the 2022

election is beyond me.

Call Democrats whatever you choose — liberals, socialists, radicals — just don’t call them divided because they are not. Remember, Stacey Abrams lost the 2018 governor’s race to Brian Kemp by only 55,000 votes out of almost 4 million cast. That is just over 1%. Her case for 2022 hasn’t been hurt by Trump’s weird comments at Perry.

Referring to Kemp, Trump said of Abrams, “Stacey, would you like to take his place? It’s OK with me. Of course, having her, I think, might be better than having your existing governor, if you want to know the truth. Might very well be better.” That might very well happen, thanks to remarks like that.

Johnny Isakson was a Republican when you could fit the party in a phonebooth. He was elected to the Georgia House of Representatives in 1976. At that time, there were four Republicans in the State Senate out of 56 members and 23 in the House along with 157 Democrats.

Isakson was named minority leader in 1983. He ran for governor against Democrat Zell Miller in 1990 and lost. In 1992, he was elected to the Georgia state senate and in 1996, the highly-partisan and education-oriented Miller appointed his former gubernatorial foe as head of the State School Board of Education. It was a stunner at the time.

Isakson remembers, “Georgia turned around. Scores got better, schools got better, people got better. Just because somebody is your opponent today doesn’t mean they can’t be your biggest friend tomorrow.”

The state’s interests first, party politics second?

Imagine that.

Isakson succeeded Newt Gingrich as U.S. Rep. in Georgia’s 6th District after the volatile speaker flamed out in 1998 and resigned. Then it was two terms

We need to elect workers to Washington, not bomb-throwers

I started my “political career” as a “concerned citizen” who spoke out at a local school board meeting.

Having volunteered nearly a decade as a PTO Treasurer and Band Booster President, a few of us loyal parent-volunteers raised concerns about our schools. We were vilified by the newspapers, but our efforts were successful: the BOE did fix the problem.

A year later, I was asked to run for school board, where I championed our amazing teachers and the incredible successes they continue to make.

Imagine my alarm when the U.S. Attorney General announced that he is asking the FBI to investigate local parents who dare voice their concerns at local school board meetings ... calling their efforts “domestic terrorism.”

Outrageous. The federal government is incapable of almost everything these days ... except to infringe on our civil liberties. I’m very glad that cities and counties and school boards and the state of Georgia

all balance their budgets every year. Yet Congress — run by both Democrats and Republicans — hasn’t balanced its budget since Bill Clinton. The federal debt — bloated by both the Left and the Right — is now over \$28 trillion ... yet the White House is printing even more money. Worse, the President comically claims that spending another \$3.5 trillion “costs zero dollars.”

The federal government can’t “provide for the common defense” anymore, as evidenced by our disastrous withdrawal from Afghanistan and the \$82 billion of military equipment we gave to terrorists. North Korea is testing missiles again, Russia is bullying us with cyberattacks, and just last week, China flew over 150 airplanes into Taiwan’s airspace, warning, “war may be triggered at any time.”

Our southern border is completely undefended. Deadly Fentanyl and scores of fundamentalist terrorists are pouring into America in record numbers ... as well as hundreds of thousands of illegal immigrants, 20% of whom test positive for COVID.

Last year, the President attacked the vaccine because he

didn’t like the former president. Last December, he vowed he would never mandate vaccines. He promised to beat COVID, but it’s actually gotten worse: more Americans have died from COVID this year, than the last.

Our federal leaders don’t “establish justice” anymore as they demand to defund the police. Virtually none of this year’s 30% increase in homicides, record street violence, and the \$2 billion in destruction of property are ever prosecuted.

The federal government doesn’t “insure domestic Tranquility” anymore, as evidenced by the hopelessly divisive rhetoric of federal politicians on both the Left and the Right.

The federal government doesn’t “promote the general welfare” anymore, as evidenced by the colossal spike in inflation, paying people to stay home, and the crippling of U.S. energy production ... all while begging OPEC to sell us more oil. Since the President took office, the average household is spending \$175 per month more on necessities, and the price of

gas is up 40% (a seven year high).

But most disturbing of all, the federal government doesn’t “secure the blessing of Liberty” anymore, as unelected bureaucrats continually weaponize the FBI against normal citizens.

Thank goodness that most of our state and local governments still function. But ... why such a broad disparity?

In my limited experience, I can honestly say that most of our local leaders are problem-solvers who want to do the right thing. In general, they serve for a few years, and then go back to their normal, everyday lives.

Not so, our federal leaders, where both the Left and the Right elect the most partisan people they can find. The crazier they sound; the more we like them. Instead of finding solutions, they talk past each other ... and they rarely ever leave.

However, she said other teachers saw her students — all of whom are handicapped in some way — were progressing in a number of areas.

“The reason my colleagues saw me as Teacher of the Year was, obviously, they saw what my kids were doing and not what I was doing,” she said. “Nobody comes in here and watches me teach every day.”

O’Brien has students who work as interns for the school’s athletic department or media center. “Things like that” allow special education students to “showcase what they can do,” she said.

“We need to build the steps for that to happen,” O’Brien said.

It also allowed her teachers to meet other teachers or students whom they normally would never meet, she said. For example, O’Brien created programs last school year in which her students interviewed Eastside teachers and, separately, allowed regular education students to work with her students.

Despite COVID prompting the school system to teach many students virtually for part of the 2020-21 school year, administrators allowed O’Brien’s students to return to in-person classes earlier than others because of the greater need for in-person training in special education.

She said she taught five students in person last year, in addition to “a few” virtually. Virtual teaching was especially challenging because of being unable to use various visual and vocal prompts teachers often need to

keep special education students focused during in-person teaching, O’Brien said.

Their families or caregivers also were required to help her students use the technology required for virtual learning and some found it difficult to do so, she said.

Eastside’s media specialist and others helped O’Brien develop a QR code and insert photos of her and other teachers into locations on the screen students saw that allowed them to log into and use online meeting platforms like Zoom without having to type in user names and passwords, she said.

“It took a lot of practice,” she said.

“We had to change the way we taught. Every lesson, we had to start with some sort of movement just so I

could get them to understand, ‘We’re going to pay attention.’ We would do yoga or types of stretching so that they knew they had to be watching.”

O’Brien, 48, is a native of the Chicago area and moved with her family to the Atlanta area at a young age. She grew up in Clayton County and earned her undergraduate degree from Georgia Southern University in 1995.

She then taught in Rockdale County for two years before moving to work for three years with young Scottish Rite Hospital patients who had suffered traumatic brain injuries.

Her six children range in age from 22 to 13 and two of them are Eastside students, she said. Around 2000, O’Brien began a 15-year hiatus from

teaching to raise her six children and work as a youth minister at Catholic churches in Newton and Gwinnett counties, she said.

She returned to teaching special education in 2017 in Morgan County and moved to Eastside the following year.

O’Brien said the experience of winning the title was “surreal.”

She said she “doesn’t have room to cook” because the numerous bouquets of flowers she received fills the kitchen of her Social Circle home.

It also included students and a band performance greeting her when she arrived on campus after she won the title.

O’Brien arrived in a 2021 Ford Bronco convertible provided by Covington Ford’s Matt Crowe.

“(Crowe) even let me

stand up in the back seat and wave to everybody,” O’Brien said. “It

was a lot of fun.”

in the U.S. House and two terms and a partial third in the United States Senate until health issues caught up with him in 2019.

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Commissioners OK \$20,000 cost of Bicentennial fireworks show

Rezoning for I-20 travel center, SPLOST-funded playground and exercise facility in west Newton park also approved

COVINGTON, Ga. — Commissioners have given county officials the green light to prepare a grand ending in December for Newton’s Bicentennial year.

The Newton County Board of Commissioners Tuesday approved a \$20,000 contract with Pyrotecnico for the Bicentennial Birthday Bash Fireworks Display Dec. 18.

The funds are coming from a \$75,000 budget the Board approved earlier this year for Bicentennial events celebrating the county’s 200th birthday.

County officials received bids from three companies. Two offered \$20,000 shows

but Pyrotecnico offered additional items for the same amount, including shells that will illuminate the number “200” in the sky, said county spokesman Bryan Fazio.

Bicentennial Committee member Latonja Hamp told commissioners the 15-minute “high impact” show will include a total of 768 shells, including 320 shells during the main show and a 420-shell finale “which gives us the magnitude practically of a Macy’s Christmas tree lighting display” or Covington’s annual Fourth of July display, Hamp said.

“This event is going

to be the event of the year,” she said.

Hamp said the cost was \$20,000 but “the good news is you only turn 200 years old one time.”

“This is the first and only time in our lifetime that we will ever be presented with this opportunity,” Hamp said.

Fazio said the Pennsylvania-based company is very familiar with Newton County and its-safety regulations after creating a number of Fourth of July and Lighting of the Square shows for the county and Covington in the past.

In other action, the Board approved

a \$99,981 contract with Bliss Products & Services for new playground equipment for Fairview Park in west Newton County.

Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax funds reserved for general parks and recreation needs will be used to cover the cost, said County Manager Lloyd Kerr.

Fairview Park is a county-owned facility located inside a subdivision off Fairview Road about three-quarters of a mile east of the Rockdale County line.

The equipment will be separated into two distinct age-appropriate areas. One area will cover about 2,700

square feet and feature equipment designed for 5- to 12-year-olds such as a double-velocity slide, five-foot horizontal loop ladder, parallel bars and other youth-oriented play equipment. The other will cover about 1,000 square feet and include equipment designed for adult fitness with stations for push-ups, chin-ups and knee lifts; a cardio walker and similar equipment.

District 3 Commissioner Alana Sanders has focused on upgrading the park since taking office in January because it is one of the few publicly owned recreational facilities in her commission dis-

trict. Her motion for the contract was approved unanimously.

Also Tuesday, the Board of Commissioners approved the county government’s request for a rezoning for construction of a travel center at I-20 and Georgia Hwy. 11 in east Newton.

The county requested the rezoning from a mix of Highway Commercial (CH) and Agricultural Residential (AR) designations to CH on the entire site covering 46 acres in the southeast corner of I-20’s exit to Georgia Hwy. 11.

The rezoning is part of an agreement between the Board of Commissioners and developer Jones Petroleum for the company to build a facility defined as a “travel center” and designed for casual or non-commercial travelers with a retail store and at least two fast-food restaurants.

Jones and property owner Jack Davis filed a lawsuit against the Board of Commissioners to appeal its February denial of the company’s rezoning request for construction

flu,” said Dr. Norris Little, M.D., chief medical officer at Piedmont Newton Hospital. “We will be providing 200 free flu shots to individuals age 12 and older during our event, but we recommend that everyone six months and older receives a flu shot.”

Those who cannot make the event are encouraged to book an appointment for a flu shot with their primary care physician, at a Piedmont QuickCare or Piedmont Urgent Care by WellStreet location.

One major difference between this flu season and last is there is now a COVID-19 vaccine

available. Everyone who is able should get both shots.

In the context of the ongoing COVID pandemic, it is especially important to get the flu shot. The CDC no longer recommends a waiting period between the flu shot and the COVID shot. So, if you plan to receive the COVID vaccine close to Oct. 22, you can still receive the flu shot at the drive-thru clinic. “In fact, while we are not able to offer the COVID vaccine at this particular event, the COVID and flu shots could even be given on the same day.”

There’s one major

way to help avoid becoming seriously ill with these respiratory viruses and that is vaccination.

“A flu shot is the first and most important step in protecting against flu,” Little said. “The flu shot has been proven to reduce cases of the flu and if you do still contract the flu virus, you’ll likely have milder symptoms and a lower risk of hospitalization and death.”

The flu and COVID-19 are both contagious respiratory illnesses that have very similar symptoms, but these two illnesses are caused by different viruses and they’re treat-

ed differently. Some of the most common symptoms seen with both flu and COVID-19 are fever, sore throat and cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, a runny nose, headache and body aches or muscle soreness. If you have symptoms of flu or COVID-19, call your doctor’s office or schedule a virtual visit as soon as possible.

“Using preventative measures like washing your hands, wearing a mask in public and watching your distance remain important,” Little said. “We are requesting that anyone planning to attend the drive-thru flu shot clinic wear a mask to reduce the risk of spreading germs to others.”

munity on June 28, Fenves announced the creation of the Twin Memorials Working Group, which he charged with implementing a plan for the memorials and associated programming.

Ellison — who, like Hicks, served on the task force — convened the working group for the first time recently and observed that they think of the group as the “dream team.”

More than a playful nod to the U.S. men’s basketball team of the 1996 Olympic Games, the working group spent its first hours sharing “dreams” for what their work can achieve.

According to Ellison and Hicks, those dreams include telling the fuller story of, and truly honoring, those who will be acknowledged; making the resultant memorials part of the curriculum; establishing even deeper ties between the two campuses; demonstrating that Emory is a welcoming, safe space for area residents and students beyond its walls; helping Emory students have a deeper appreciation of the uni-

versity’s past; turning deserved attention to current campus workers, especially the hourly staff; and not only creating this as a living memorial but enjoying to the fullest the shared experience of doing so together.

By taking advantage of relevant scholarship, learning more about similar initiatives at peer institutions and building on the aims stated in the task force report, the Twin Memorials Working Group will draft requests-for-proposal (RFPs) for architectural firms to design and construct the twin memorials.

In addition, the group will develop plans for annual events, university-wide programming and orientation for new students — all designed not only to memorialize enslaved laborers and their descendants but also to recognize those who continued to work on both campuses following emancipation.

A key part of the working group’s ambitious agenda is coordinating community input to ensure that what is created, both for the memorials themselves

and the related programming, reflects the diverse stakeholders who will engage with it.

“We look forward to presenting the stories and legacy of these individuals who are so central to our history,” Ellison said. “Our job is to dream together and to gather the collective dreams of our community — and that means not just Emory but the larger metro Atlanta community.”

“Once the memorials are established, we are eager for our own community, as well as visitors to our Atlanta and Oxford campuses, to learn more not just about Emory but about themselves.”

In a related action, Fenves said in a statement Sept. 27 that the Emory Board of Trustees had approved an official “Land Acknowledgment” for Emory University.

“This statement is a recognition of the Muscogee (Creek) and other indigenous nations who were displaced in the years before Emory’s founding,” Fenves said.

Fenves said a group of Emory leaders, historians and experts from

across the university composed the Land Acknowledgment “building upon years of work undertaken by faculty, staff, and students to recognize the legacy of native and indigenous dispossession on the lands of Emory’s campuses.”

“This statement is about accountability as much as it is about understanding our past. And my hope is that it will inspire powerful conversations on our campuses as well as action and engagement.

He announced the formation of a working group to plan development of a Language Path on the Emory campuses to honor the Muscogee (Creek) Nation and highlight the Muscogee language and culture.

“The university has also begun taking steps to establish a stronger connection with the Muscogee Nation. We are linked through our history, and it is my hope that we can work together and be a part of each other’s present and future for the benefit of our communities.”

they place on social media,” Williams said.

TikTok is a video-sharing platform that hosts short-form videos ranging from 15 seconds to one minute each.

The platform “revolves around

sharing 15-second videoclips, which are set to music often licensed from artists and record labels,” according to a report in the magazine Wired.

It also has become infamous in recent months for its mostly

young users creating “challenges” in some videos that encourage potentially dangerous stunts like climbing on stacked milk crates, and costly and illegal actions such as vandalizing and damaging school restrooms.

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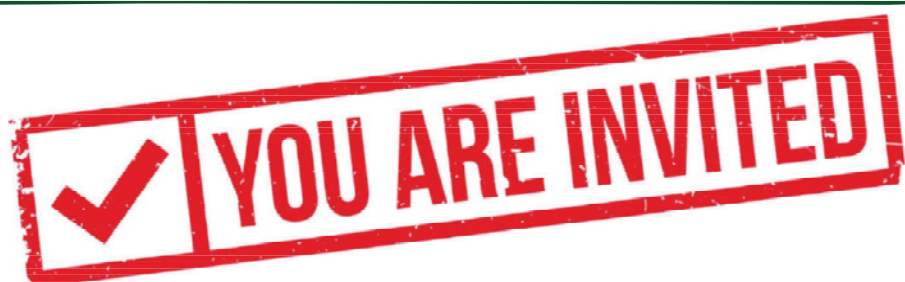
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Central Church hosts Pink Glow Out 5K

of a facility defined as a "truck stop" catering primarily to over-the-road tractor-trailer operators and their 24-hour work schedules.

They agreed to drop the lawsuit and build a travel center in exchange for the rezoning needed to build it.

County commissioners recently approved changes to the zoning ordinance that essentially will ban construction of truck stops in most parts of unincorporated Newton.

Jones Petroleum will be required to use brick on the facade of the building and create a 100-foot buffer between its parking lot and Hwy. 11 — among other special conditions and requirements for new construction in the Brick Store overlay zoning district in which it is located.

The Board on Tuesday also:

- Approved the county GIS Department's

request for a contract with GeoComm Inc. for consulting support on a project to prepare the city-county 911 system for Next Generation 911 data standards.

Officials said the support is needed to help prepare the system for an upgrade designed to provide more accurate location of emergency callers who use cellular phones rather than the current system which dates to when land-line telephones were the primary phone source.

The county government and cities within Newton that are part of the 911 system are sharing the \$222,413 cost.

- Approved the Newton County District Attorney's Office's request for renewal of the Victim of Crimes Act (VOCA) grant to help cover the costs of filling Victim Advocate positions held by Cindy Hooper, Gabriela Arredondo and Leslie Smith; and the Victim

Compensation Advocate position held by Ellen Bales.

The grant will provide about \$76,000 of the \$199,078 cost of salaries for the Victim Advocate positions and \$43,000 of the Compensation Advocate salary, District Attorney Randy McGinley said. The District Attorney's General Fund will cover the remainder.

- Approved the Newton County Sheriff's Office's request to apply for a Naloxone grant from the Criminal Justice Coordinating Council to allow it to give the drug Narcan to individuals who have overdosed on opioids or other similar drugs.

- Approved the Newton County Sheriff's Office's request to accept the 2021 State Homeland Security Award in the amount of \$19,036 from the state Emergency Management and Homeland Security office.

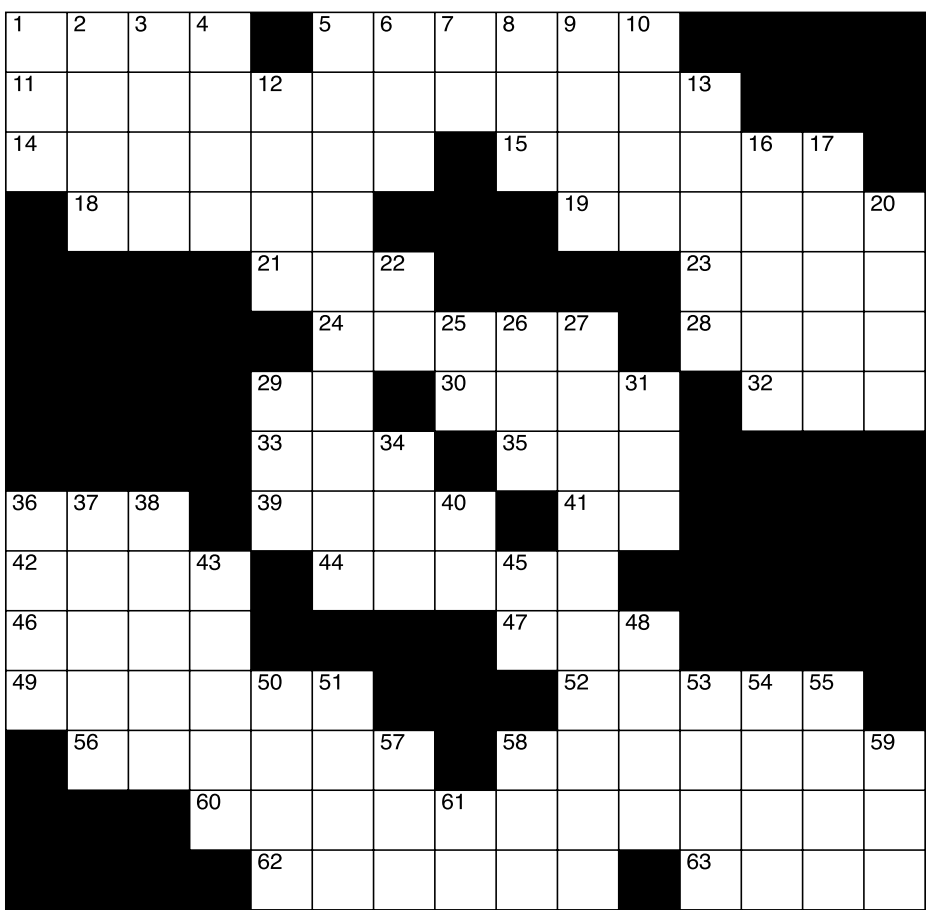

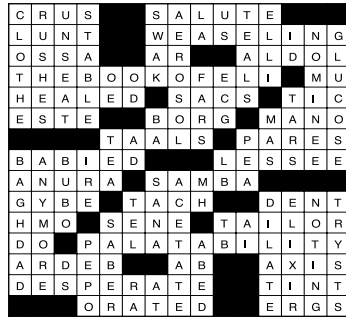

COMPLAINT FOR FORFEITURE

COMES NOW THE STATE OF GEORGIA by and through Randy McGinley, District Attorney of the Alcovy Judicial Circuit or his lawfully appointed assistant, and files this Complaint for Forfeiture pursuant to O.C.G.A. §§ 16-13-49 and 9-16-1, et. seq., and shows the following:

1. THE PROPERTY sought to be forfeited is set out in the caption of this complaint and is hereinafter referred to as "The Defendant Property."

2. THE PROPERTY sought to be forfeited was located and found on or about January 14, 2021, during the execution of a search warrant that was issued for the property at 5467 Highway 162 South, Covington, GA 30016. Claimant Frank Settambrino resided at this property. Law enforcement found over 1000 grams of methamphetamine. In addition, a large amount of cash and other items were found and seized by law enforcement. A full list of the property seized is attached as Exhibit A. Claimant Frank Settambrino was arrested for Trafficking Methamphetamine.

3. THE SEIZED property is physically located in Newton County, Georgia, and is currently in the custody of Special Investigations Unit of the Newton County Sheriff's Office. This Court has subject matter jurisdiction over the Defendant's Property and venue is proper in this Court.

4. ON JANUARY 14, 2021 members of the Newton County Sheriff's Office, Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA), and Monroe County Sheriff's Office executed a search warrant at the residence located at 5467 Highway 162 South, Covington, Georgia 30016.

5. DURING the course of the search of the residence located at 5467 Highway 162 South, Covington, Georgia 30016, TFO Cole found a gray plastic bag on the floor in the garage which contained two clear plastic bags that had 249.9

GRAMS OF methamphetamine and a digital scale.

6. DURING THE search of the shed located at 5467 Highway 162 South, Covington, Georgia 30016, TFO Cole located a USPS box that contained a Folgers classic roast coffee can with methamphetamine inside and a clear plastic bag that contained methamphetamine. Additionally, there was Kooler ice bag that contained 476.1 grams of methamphetamine. Both the USPS box and the Kooler ice bag was located inside the bed of a Chevrolet truck inside the shed.

7. DURING THE search of a bedroom of the residence located at 5467 Highway 162 South, Covington, Georgia 30016 Newton County Sheriff deputies located five (5) counterfeit One Hundred dollar bills inside a dresser drawer.

8. INSIDE THE same bedroom as the counterfeit money, deputies located Three Thousand Two Hundred Thirty-Six Dollars and Thirty-Seven Cents (\$3,236.37) in U.S. Currency.

9. THE REMAINING Defendant Property included in exhibit "A" was found throughout the property of the residence located at 5467 Highway 162 South, Covington, Georgia 30016.

10. THE EVIDENCE collected by law enforcement shows that the methamphetamine was possessed with the intent to traffic, in violation of O.C.G.A. § 16-13-30.

11. No points allowed

No. 2 Georgia pits top defense against Nix, No. 18 Auburn

After Bo Nix and Auburn were able to scramble their way through LSU’s Death Valley they are now looking to put up points on Georgia’s stifling defense.

The second-ranked Bulldogs (5-0, 3-0 Southeastern Conference), fresh from two straight league shutouts and virtually unscathed defensively this season, visit Nix and the No. 18 Tigers on Saturday.

Auburn (4-1, 1-0) managed its first win at LSU since 1999, thanks largely to Nix’s ability to make plays on the move. Now they face the nation’s top defense, a group that has only allowed one meaningless touchdown late in a blowout win over South Carolina.

“One of the better teams that we’ve faced and one of the better teams I’ve faced really in college,” Nix said. “They have one of the best defenses I’ve faced and the challenge is definitely there. But I think we’re willing to accept it.”

The Bulldogs just brushed off one upstart challenger, then-No. 8 Arkansas, to a 37-0 tune. But a group that leads the nation giving up just 4.6 points and

178.6 yards per game is used to facing teams aiming to be the first one to win that matchup.

“Every team we play, we figure we’re going to get their best and they’re going to get our best,” Georgia safety Christopher Smith said. “It’s extra motivation for them, extra motivation for us because every game during the season is a playoff game and we both want to win this game very badly.”

BULLDOGS QUARTERBACK

Georgia quarterback Stetson Bennett, who has filled in while JT Daniels has been out with a lat injury, made his first college start last season against the Tigers. Bennett led No. 4 Georgia to a 27-6 win over No. 7 Auburn, passing for 240 yards and a touchdown. Georgia coach Kirby Smart hasn’t indicated which quarterback will start Saturday.

FAMILIAR FACES

Auburn’s offense has some names quite familiar to Georgia fans. Offensive coordinator Mike Bobo is a former Bulldogs quarterback and coordinator and offensive line coach Will Friend

is also an ex-Georgia assistant. Plus Auburn wide receiver Demetris Robertson transferred from Athens during the offseason.

“We didn’t want to see D-Rob go,” Smart said. “I’ve always thought a lot of D-Rob. He’d gotten better and the situation we’re in now is because some guys decided to leave. That’s why we’re so thin along with injuries.”

NOT NOVEMBER

It’s only the second time since 1936 the two teams have met outside of November. The Bulldogs won on Oct. 3 last year in the second game of a season shortened by the pandemic. Auburn pushed for the move to avoid facing its two biggest rivals — and the current SEC powers — Georgia and Alabama to end each regular season.

‘TRUE’ ROAD GAME

The Bulldogs already have played two games away from Athens, but the visit to Auburn will be different. This will be the first game this season the Georgia fans will be outnumbered. Georgia red dominated the stands in their 62-0 win at Vanderbilt on Sept. 25. The opener

against Clemson was played at a neutral site in Charlotte, North Carolina.

“We know our guys are getting ready to go into a very tough environment, which playing at Auburn is probably one of the toughest places to play in the SEC,” Smart said.

SUPERMAN DREAM

Georgia center Sedrick Van Pran wanted to be Superman when he was a boy. Actually, he wanted to be Auburn quarterback Cam Newton, who used the Superman nickname, and he wanted to play in Newton’s home stadium.

Van Pran said Newton was his favorite player when he grew up in New Orleans and he dreamed of playing at Jordan-Hare Stadium. He said he showed that love as the starting quarterback for his flag football team.
