Superior Court

Walton County Magistrate to succeed Ott

Kevin Morris also longtime
attorney for governments

MONROE, Ga. — Walton County attorney and Magistrate Judge Kevin Morris will replace longtime Superior Court Judge John Ott when he retires at the end of this month.

Gov. Brian Kemp on Friday, Dec. 16, named Morris to serve as one of five Superior Court judges for Newton County to fill a vacancy that will be created by the resignation of Ott on Dec. 31.

Morris, 51, of Monroe, has served as the Walton County Magistrate Court judge since 2014.

A date had not been set for his swearing-in, Morris said on Monday.

After he is sworn in, he will learn when and where he will hear his first cases in the two-county Alcovy Judicial Circuit, Morris said.

He said he was honored that "Gov. Kemp selected me for appointment to the Superior Court for the Alcovy Circuit, and I am excited and ready to serve the citizens of Walton and Newton counties."

"The past few weeks have been a whirlwind and I am eager to be sworn in so that I can join the current bench and get to work," Morris said.

Superior Courts in Georgia have exclusive, constitutional authority over felonies, divorces, equity cases and matters regarding title to land.

Morris will replace Ott, a fellow Monroe resident who is the judicial circuit's chief judge and has served

Newton students' apps earn top honors in national competition

COVINGTON, Ga. — A pair of Newton College & Career Academy (NCCA) students were among top winners in an annual national competition to encourage computer science education.

Kevin Wadsworth of Covington was the winner of this year's Congressional App Challenge competition in the 4th Congressional District that includes part of Newton and three other counties, U.S. Rep. Hank Johnson announced.

Joshua Moreland of Newton County was a runner-up in the 10th Congressional District part of the 2022 Congressional App Challenge, U.S. Rep. Jody Hice announced.

Moreland finished second behind a trio of North Oconee High School students in the 24-county district that includes part of Newton.

This marked the first year students from the school competed in the Congressional App Challenge.

The U.S. House of Representatives launched the competition in 2015. It allows students to compete against their peers by creating an application (or game for mobile phones, tablets or computer devices, according to information from Johnson's office

The challenge is designed to promote innovation and engagement in coding and computer science, and shows the value of computer science and STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, the Arts and Mathematics) education.

Chad Walker, principal of Newton College & Career Academy, said he was proud of the students.

"To have a winner and a runner-up in our very first year of competing in the Challenge is amazing. Kevin and Joshua are both outstanding scholars and they definitely represented our school and our district extremely well."

Newton County Schools Superintendent Samantha Fuhrey said, "I am thrilled that Kevin and Joshua participated in the competition and incredibly proud that they represented Newton College and Career Academy and our school system so well."

"The fact that they have been selected first and second place respectively is extraordinary. Congratulations to Kevin and Joshua and the teachers and families who supported them."

Data company scanning city streets to find maintenance needs

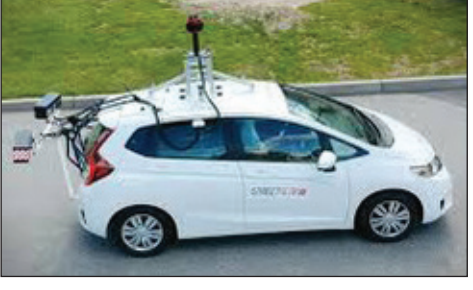

COVINGTON, Ga. — Covington recently hired a data collection company to travel over more than 100 miles of city streets to determine their condition.

The city contracted with Street Scan Inc. whose specially-equipped vehicles began collecting data and taking images of street conditions Saturday, Dec. 17, said Lee Harvey, the city's public works director.

"This data will help us determine which streets are in the most need of maintenance," Harvey said.

Harvey said Street Scan began

collecting data Saturday, Dec. 17, to meet pre-determined deadlines.

The company is performing a "mobile sensing survey" of 107 miles of city roads and was to com-

plete its work Tuesday, Dec. 20.

StreetScan's "vehicle-based data collection provides up-to-date and objective information on road asset conditions," a news release stated.

StreetScan CEO Jon-Erik Dillon said its work for Covington "will provide objective analysis, enabling the city to make objective, data-driven, informed decisions on roadway improvements and optimize the city's resources."

It is using vehicles equipped with 3-D imaging technology designed "to detect and measure road defects such as cracking and bumps."

Its vehicles assess the condition of roadways in normal traffic flow

and develop an inventory of road conditions on a scale from 0 to 100 — with 0 being the worst and 100 being "ideal," the release stated.

Survey results will be delivered to the city in early 2023, the company said.

It is using a web-based application that provides "an enriched view of the city's street network with color-coded pavement conditions and other assets, along with images for every scanned road and a range of data-driven decision-making tools."

The application, called Street-

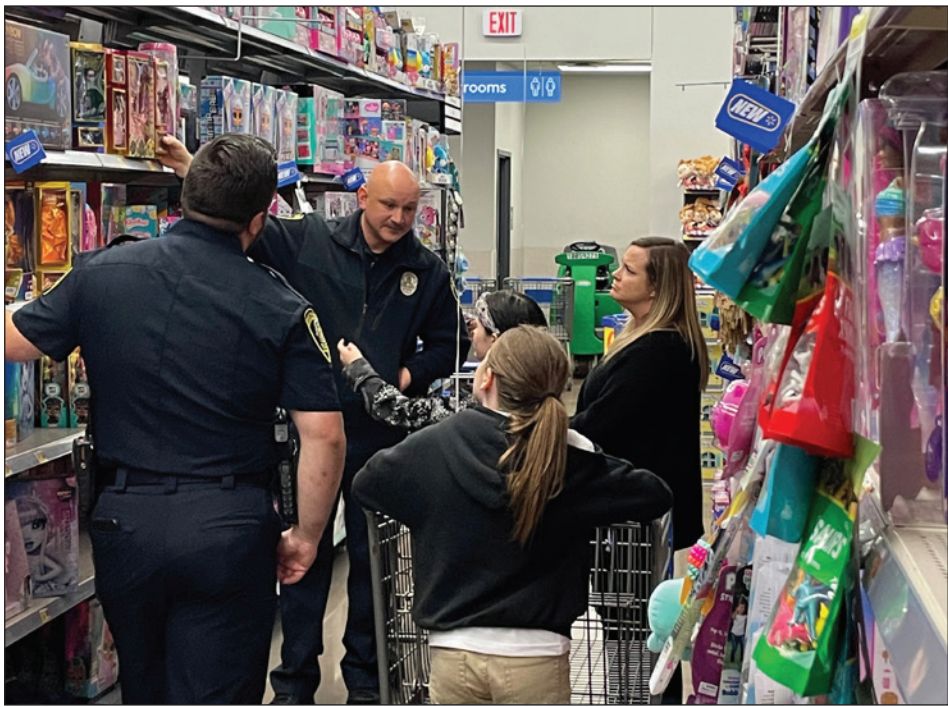

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The students' teacher, Maureen Ryan, also said she was proud of the recognition Moreland and Wadsworth received.

"Our Embedded Computing class submitted 15 apps between U.S. Congressional District 4 and District 10," Ryan said. "All of our associates created meaningful 'Apps for Good,' which are apps designed to help the user, and I am proud of all the submissions this year."

Wadsworth's winning app, "The Vent Box," was created using Java Script and Block Code, Ryan said.

The 17-year-old student designed it to be an app for all students who need to vent

out any emotions and frustrations and get help for any type of feelings they are dealing with, she said.

"Kevin took inspiration from a moment of frustration and turned it into something witty and wonderful," Ryan said. "That's something to be proud of and an example we can all learn from."

"I am very fortunate to work with Kevin and all the many inspiring associates at NCCA as they learn and lead us to a better tomorrow."

Wadsworth said his "main inspiration to create this app was my own personal journey."

"My own problems with emotions inspired

me to create this app for myself and for others who may have similar obstacles to face," Wadsworth said.

He said The Vent Box includes resources to help anyone feeling anxious, angry, depressed, stressed — or any combination.

"The vent box also offers information on different safety hotlines to use if you're feeling irrational at a certain moment," he said.

Moreland "looked to find a way to help young learners recognize and understand basic math skills" by creating an app called "Math Link" after watching family members struggle with math

concepts, Ryan said.

"And then he added a Spanish version to his app as well," she said.

Students were judged on quality of the app's "idea," including creativity and originality; implementation of the idea, including user experience and design; and the ability to demonstrate coding and programming skills.

Hice, R-Greensboro, said he was "specifically honored to recognize the hard work and ingenuity" of Moreland.

"I hope ... you continue to code and keep up the impressive work," Hice said.

Johnson, D-Stonecrest, said science and technology "are trans-

forming our world and I'm proud of the students who go above and beyond their school's curriculum and other everyday tasks to compete in the challenge."

"The App Challenge allows us to showcase some of the 4th Congressional District's brightest young minds as they take on cutting-edge technology that is becoming an increasing part of all our lives," Johnson said.

Because he was the winner in the 4th District, Wadsworth will receive an invitation to Washington, D.C., to demonstrate his app at the annual #HouseOf-Code celebration.

The event allows

winning students to see their apps displayed in the U.S. Capitol Building, meet their representatives, and connect with other coders from around the country.

Johnson is also working on additional ways to celebrate Kevin Wadsworth and his app in the New Year, according to his office.

Ceremony organizers seek award nominees

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COVINGTON, Ga. — Nominees are being sought for the three major awards to be given during Newton County's 38th annual Commemorative Celebration of the Life and Legacy of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

The awards will be announced during the virtual event which will be broadcast via YouTube and Facebook Live on Jan. 15, 2023, at 3 p.m.

The event annually recognizes and celebrates adults, youth and organizations "who contribute to advancing peace and unity in the Newton County community," the release stated.

Nominees for each award should meet the following criteria:

- I Have a Dream Award: The nominee must have given at least two years of service to the Newton County community; must be a registered voter; be affiliated with a church, synagogue or worship center; made contributions to the community that are nonprofit and visible to the community; made nondiscriminatory contributions; and "models a spirit of peace and unity," will initiate and support "change," have a "humble spirit," be "steadfast in his or her convictions" and "fosters and supports education on all levels."

- Trailblazer Award: The nominee must be a longtime Newton County resident, a registered voter, and "a creator of change in the community and

follow through to implementation."

The "change facilitated by the nominee must be a benefit to the community"; the nominee "must be resourceful and committed to all aspects of the county," and "must foster a cohesive spirit of peace, unity, diversity and love."

- Young Dreamer Award: The nominee must be a Newton County resident enrolled in one of the county's public schools; must be in grades kindergarten through 12; must have demonstrated interest "in fostering peace, unity, diversity and love among his or her peers"; and must have "made a difference in the lives of others who may have otherwise been overlooked, ignored or disadvantaged."

Each nomination should include:

- The name, address and phone number of the person making the nomination;
- The name and address of the nominee (including school and grade for Young Dreamer Award nominees);
- A typed statement of 250 to 500 words explaining how the nominee meets or exceeds the criteria for the award.

All nomination submissions should be received by 6 p.m. on Jan. 6, 2023. Nominations may be submitted directly online.

Warming shelter opens for homeless residents

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COVINGTON, Ga. — The Covington and Newton County governments have partnered on operation of a warming center for homeless area residents. The shelter recently at Rainbow Covenant Ministries on Hemlock Street in Porterdale, said director Pastor Clara Lett. Newton County Board of Commissioners on Dec. 6 voted to

use \$50,000 in federal American Rescue Plan Act funds for the shelter's operation by Lett and the Garden of Gethsemane Homeless Shelter. The board's action followed the Covington City Council's Nov. 21 vote to pay \$40,000 for its operation. Lett said she is expecting about 20 will use the shelter. They primarily will travel to the shelter by van from three pick-up points at the parking lot of the homeless

shelter on Turner Lake Circle, the Covington Gallery shopping center on Turner Lake Road near Access Road, and Repairers of the Breach Thrift Center on Washington Street. Security will be provided. Those using the shelter will not be asked to leave in the morning if temperatures are in the low 30s. Lett said. For more information, call 770-787-8519.

Panel recommends music industry tax incentives

ATLANTA — Georgia should institute a 30% to 35% tax credit for music-production expenses to help grow the state's music industry, a bipartisan legislative study committee recommended this week. The tax incentive would encourage out-of-state productions to invest in Georgia musicians, the committee said. The state should also set the amount of spending needed to qualify for the tax incentive to \$25,000 for recorded musical productions and

allow companies to aggregate multiple projects to meet that threshold. The committee also recommended lowering the spending threshold to earn the tax credit to \$200,000 for musical or theatrical tours that start in Georgia. This would encourage productions, including Broadway touring companies and major musical acts, to launch their tours in Georgia. The state should set up a Georgia Music Office within the Office of the Governor to publicize Georgia's musical talent and attract music companies to the state. That office, modeled on

a similar, successful office in Texas, should have three full-time staffers, the committee recommended. The new music office should create a "Music City" certification that Georgia cities could earn if they meet certain requirements. That would help bolster musical networks and draw attention to the music industry in the designated cities. The program would be modeled on a similar program in Texas that has so far certified over 35 cities in that state. Georgia should also set up a music commission to advise the new music

office. That commission should include music-industry leaders, businesspeople, and music educators. The state should set up grants for between \$5,000 and \$25,000 to help support local musicians and recording studios, the committee recommended. Georgia should also designate music-production development jobs as high-demand careers for the purposes of the Technical College System of Georgia's new High-Demand Career Initiative program. That would provide funding for employers to create paid apprenticeship programs.

on the Superior Court bench since 1990. "It is also quite humbling to be tapped to follow Judge Ott, who has served this community faithfully as a judge for more than 30 years," Morris said. Morris has lived in Walton County for more than 20 years and makes his home in Monroe with his wife and three children. A native Georgian, Morris graduated from the University of Georgia in 1994 and moved to Shizuoka, Japan, to teach English and business communications to Japanese executives. In 1999, Morris graduated from Mercer Law School and

began handling complex litigation claims involving local governments. He has served as the deputy county attorney for Butts and Henry counties. Since joining his current firm, William, Morris and Waymire in Buford, he continued representing local governments in municipal liability claims. Morris has handled numerous appeals to the 11th Circuit and routinely appears before the court for oral argument, he said. As a Magistrate judge, he presides over civil and criminal cases and serves as the Technology Chair for the Council of Magistrate Court Judges.

He was among three Walton County residents the state Judicial Nominating Commission recommended to Kemp as finalists for the position that presides over criminal and civil cases in Newton and Walton counties. Other finalists were W. Cliff Howard, who is chief assistant district attorney in the Walton County District Attorney's office in Monroe; and R. Michael Malcom, an attorney and partner in the Preston & Malcom P.C. law firm in Monroe. Nine people from Newton and Walton counties were nominated for the position after Ott announced on

Oct. 1 he would retire at the end of this year. District Attorney Randy McGinley, a Monroe resident, and Newton County Probate and Magistrate Judge Melanie Bell were among the nominees. Other nominees included Destiny H. Bryant, who is associate Probate and Magistrate judge for Newton County; W. Cliff Howard, who is chief assistant district attorney for Walton County; Jennifer Arndt, who is chief assistant public defender for the judicial circuit; and attorneys Bryan H. Frost of Covington and Anne T. LaMalva and Michael R. Malcom, both of Monroe.

McGinley later said he wanted to remain as district attorney

and did not want his nomination considered.

The coming war over Biden's son

Republican lawmakers will take control of the House of Representatives on Jan. 3. That means that, among many other things, they will take control of the House's investigative committees and subcommittees. GOP leaders have already said they plan to probe the Biden administration's disastrous policy on the U.S.-Mexico border, the disastrous withdrawal of U.S. troops from Afghanistan, the disastrous failure to stop the flow of fentanyl into the U.S., and more.



There is clearly a lot to investigate. But the topic that will receive the most attention in the media and the political conversation will be the investigation into the business dealings of the Biden family — Joe, Hunter and Jim Biden.

"Committee Republicans have spoken with multiple whistleblowers from numerous schemes involving the Biden family, reviewed Hunter Biden's laptop, and received documents of previously unknown transactions," House Oversight Committee chairman-to-be Rep. James Comer told a news conference on Nov. 17. "What we found are business plans aimed at targets around the world based on influence peddling, including with people closely tied to foreign governments like China and Russia." The Bidens, Comer said, "flourished and became millionaires by simply offering access to 'The Family.'"

Press coverage of the investigation will likely fall into two categories. The first will focus on traditional coverage of what the committee discovers, what witnesses tell investigators, what documents are involved, etc. The second will ignore those developments or attack the investigation itself.

Right now, Comer is working hard to convince the public that his probe will be a Joe Biden investigation — that is, an investigation into the actions of the president of the United States — and not a Hunter Biden investigation. "In 2019, shortly after announcing his campaign for president, Joe Biden told the American people he had nothing to do with and never had conversations with his family about their business deals," Comer said on Nov. 17. "That was a lie. Whistleblowers describe President Biden as 'chairman of the board' for these businesses. He personally participated in meetings and phone calls. Documents show that he was a 'partner' with access to an office. To be clear: Joe Biden is the 'Big Guy.'" That last was a reference to Hunter Biden's repeated references to his father as the "Big Guy." Hunter's business partners used the phrase, too; one of them wrote that in a 2017 Chinese energy deal,

10% of the money would be "held by H for the big guy."

Republicans know that for many years, Joe Biden, who served in the U.S. Senate from 1973 to 2009, described himself as "the poorest man in Congress." "I entered as one of the poorest men in Congress, left one of the poorest men in government, in Congress and as vice president," Biden said when he was running for president in 2019. By that, what Biden really meant was that he was one of the most ethical men in Congress — that, unlike some others, he did not use his office to cash in. Now, GOP investigators want to see if Biden benefited from his son's shadowy income stream, which of course was made possible by Hunter Biden cashing in on his father's name.

Comer wants to investigate all that. But the more Comer talks about substance — deals, business partners, money, bank records — the more Democrats and their allies in the political and journalism worlds accuse Republicans of beating a dead horse, or being obsessed with the pornography that the cocaine-addicted Hunter Biden made and kept on his laptop. And now, the Washington Post reports that a number of wealthy Biden supporters are planning an assault against the investigators and witnesses in the Hunter Biden probe. They are assembling what the Post calls a "sprawling infrastructure" that is "rapidly, almost frantically assembling to combat Republicans' plans to turn Hunter Biden into a major news story when the GOP takes over the House next year."

The pro-Hunter group includes Kevin Morris, a high-powered entertainment attorney in Hollywood who at some point became friends with Hunter Biden and is now paying Hunter's back taxes and monthly bills. Morris reportedly paid Hunter Biden's \$2 million back taxes bill. He reportedly pays his friend's rent, too — around \$20,000 a month.

Morris reportedly is advising his friend and beneficiary to get tough with those Republicans who want to delve into the connection between Hunter Biden's highly lucrative business deals and Hunter Biden's father. According to the Post, Morris is advocating that Hunter file defamation suits against Fox News, against President Trump's son Eric, and against Rudy Giuliani. Morris also, according to the Post, wants "extensive research," which means dirt-digging, on "two potential witnesses against Hunter Biden — a spurned business partner named Tony Bobulinski and a computer repairman named John Paul Mac Isaac." It was Mac Isaac to whom Hunter took his laptop for repair and then apparently

I know some of you expect hard-hitting political commentary when reading a newspaper column. Well, not today. There are no elections any time soon, and we could all use a break.

Often, I'll say something my elders used to say, and my young co-workers will look at me like I'm older than dirt ("long in the tooth"). I said I was "tickled to death" about something, and they were bewildered.

As for my younger friends, "Crack the window" means one thing to me, but something totally different to them. Same with "cut off the lights," or "crank up the car."

Those of us who grew up with rotary phones, long cords, and party lines get laughed at when we say we're going to "dial a number." Imagine trying to explain a collect call, a phone booth, or long distance.

Now when we gas up the car, we give it very little thought. Remember when we had to make a choice at the "fillin' station?" Would it be "ragular" gas, as everyone pronounced it, or that overpriced "high test?"

Today's kids are growing up without important meteorological knowledge. During the next heavy rain, who's going to tell them whether it's a frog strangler, a toad choker, or a gully washer?

These days, kids act up on the school bus. That didn't happen when I was growing up. Mr. Dewey Cooper was my bus driver, and when a kid got out of line, Mr. Dewey would glare into the rear-view mirror, and say, "Boy, if you don't sit down, I'll bend you over my checkered apron." We never actually saw that apron, but we lived in fear that we would. At least he didn't say the scariest phrase of all, which was often uttered by our parents: "Go cut me a switch," which was usually followed by, "Not that one. Find a bigger one!"

I enjoy talking to Southern friends who are a few years older. They take me back home just by telling a story. If you're from up North, I'll provide a little translation.

"See that girl there, she sure favors (resembles) her granny, don't she? Well, anyways, her daddy is as lazy as a sack of taters. His mama would try to get some work out

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Holiday Travel in Georgia

AAA: 3.5M Georgians to travel for the holidays

Record-setting number is 113,000 more than 2021

ATLANTA — ’Tis the season to travel and AAA estimates over 3.5 million Georgians will journey 50 miles or more away from home, Dec. 23 to Jan. 2.

That number is an increase of almost 113,000 people over last year and a new record-high for the year-end holiday travel period in Georgia.

National travel figures are also stronger than 2021, yet slightly lower than pre-pandemic levels.

An estimated 112.7 million Americans are forecast to travel during for the year-end holidays. That’s an increase of 3.6 million people compared to last year and the third busiest since AAA began tracking in 2000.

“Despite inflationary pressures, consumers remained resilient and dedicated to travel this year. The holidays also benefit from the desire

to reconnect with loved ones,” said Debbie Haas, vice president of travel for AAA – The Auto Club Group.

“Travelers are spending more on travel than any other time in the past two years. The good news is the cost for a holiday road trip will be less expensive than anticipated, now that gas prices are on the way down.”

Holiday road trippers also are getting the early gift of plunging prices at the pump. On Sunday, the average price for gasoline in Georgia was \$2.88 per gallon — 27 cents per gallon less than a year ago.

“Since most Americans have already made their holiday travel plans, these plunging pump prices may not necessarily lead to more auto travelers,” said Montrae Waiters, spokeswoman for AAA – The Auto Club Group.

“What we often see instead is consumers reallocating the added savings; spending more on hotels, shopping and dining out.”

Nationwide, 90% of holiday travelers will drive to their destinations.

In Georgia, 3.2 million residents will take at least one holiday road trip — over 66,000 more than last year and a 1% increase from 2019.

Drivers should prepare for delays, particularly in and around major metro areas.

Nationwide, drivers could see travel times increase by 25%, according to INRIX, a provider of transportation analytics and insights. The most congested days on the road are forecast to be Dec. 23 — the Friday before Christmas — and Dec. 27 and 28 and Jan. 2. INRIX predicts the single busiest travel day will be Dec. 27.

The best advice for avoiding congestion is leave early in the morning or later in the evening, AAA suggests..

AAA’s advice for auto travelers:

- Leave early so you are not in a rush.
- Watch the weather. Consider alternate routes or adjust your departure time to avoid driving through harsh weather.
- Never drive distracted. Pre-pro-

gram your GPS and put the cellphone down while driving.

- Wear your seat belt and never drive impaired.
- Ensure your vehicle has an emergency kit. This should include jumper cables, a first-aid kit, car/portable phone charger(s), flashlight with extra batteries, and drinking water and snacks for everyone in the car.

Air travel will see a 14% increase over last year, with nearly 7.2 million Americans expected to fly. Flights and airports will be packed this holiday season, reminiscent of pre-pandemic days.

Demand for flights has surged despite higher airline ticket prices. AAA expects the number of people taking holiday flights this year will come close to matching 2019 when 7.3 million Americans traveled by air.

Other modes of transportation are also rebounding in a big way. AAA estimates travel by bus, rail, and cruise ship will rise to 3.6 million this holiday season, a 23% increase from last year and nearly 94% of 2019’s volume.

forgot what he had done with it.

Morris is joined in advocating an aggressive strategy by David Brock, who in the 1990s styled himself a “right-wing hitman” writing articles attacking Bill and Hillary Clinton. Then Brock changed sides, trying to ingratiate himself with the very people he had earlier attacked. The right-wing hitman became a left-wing hitman, not to mention a prolific fundraiser. Now, Brock has formed a new group, Facts First USA, to fight Republicans who want

to investigate Hunter Biden and other Biden administration topics.

Some Democrats disagree strongly with the aggressive strategy. After all, Hunter Biden is a former drunk and crackhead who made a huge amount of money through questionable business deals in which he sought to cash in on his father’s name and influence. He then blew the money on booze, crack and prostitutes, after which he sought new, and even shadier, ways to further cash in on his father’s name and

influence. This was no youthful indiscretion; Hunter Biden is 52 years old and has only been off drugs for a couple of years.

It’s not a heartwarming American story. “No one thinks this strategy of putting Hunter Biden front and center is smart,” one Democrat involved in the larger defense effort told the Post. “No one, including the White House, thinks this is a smart strategy.” The more cautious Democrats in the Hunter Biden defense effort want to argue that he is “clearly

a private citizen and an inappropriate target for Congress to investigate,” according to the Post, and that “Republicans are more concerned with pursuing conspiracies than solving the country’s problems.”

That’s where Comer’s investigation plan comes in. He appears to be focused like a laser beam on the Joe Biden angle of the Hunter Biden story. He wants to get copies of “suspicious activity reports” that banks filed about various Hunter Biden transactions. He wants to delin-

eate what he believes are the extensive financial ties between Hunter and Joe Biden, as well as the president’s brother Jim Biden, who was also in on the business. “We are focused on the bank records,” he said on Nov. 17. “The most important thing for us, right now, is to get those bank records.”

In other words, it’s all about Joe Biden’s business. To hear Comer talk, Hunter Biden is almost a bit player in the Hunter Biden investigation. “We’re not trying to prove Hunter Biden is a

bad actor,” Comer said. “He is. If anybody wants to disagree with that, then there’s nothing we have to talk about. Our investigation is about Joe Biden.”

Redskins endure stiff tests early on

SOCIAL CIRCLE, Ga. — Head coach Taylor Jackson knew heading into the 2022-23 season that this year’s team will have many trials by fire. It doesn’t get much hotter than the atmosphere inside Social Circle’s gymnasium last Tuesday night against Morgan County.

Through it all, the Redskins avenged their earlier season loss and downed the Bulldogs 59-50. Many moments became so intense that at one point in the third quarter, Jackson ditched his dress jacket and rolled up his sleeves while coaching. “We do it to ourselves with the scheduling,” Jackson said with a hoarse voice. “We’ve been in an atmosphere like that in the early season so far. We are getting more accustomed to the guys who have to produce in that environment.”

A few Redskins had monumental moments throughout the closely contested game. But things got really heated down the stretch of the third quarter.

Lamarius Jackson broke away for what seemed to be an easy fast break layup. However, a Morgan County player raced down and fouled Lamarius on the attempt that the referees doubled down on, counting it as a technical foul.

That helped cap off the third frame in which the Redskins outscored Morgan County 21-9 to give themselves a 46-27 lead.

Morgan County put together a run of its own, trimming its deficit to just nine points with 4:04 remaining in the game.

But the Redskins’ aggressive style on both ends of the floor proved too much.

By the 1:56 mark, Social Circle had rebuilt its lead 59-44 and Bulldog fans could be seen heading for the exits.

While Tuesday was a home game for Social Circle, there were times where it seemed like a neutral site contest with both programs’ fans showing up in big numbers.

It was reminiscent of a playoff game.

“It was a nice atmosphere tonight,” SCHS principal Tim Armstrong told Jackson after the game.

Up until Dec. 13’s victory over the Bulldogs, Social Circle’s lone loss came against Morgan County on Dec. 2, 77-67. That loss caused the Redskins to honor their program rule of dressing up in ties on gameday in the regular season for the first time since Jan. 16, 2021.

Jackson was proud of his team’s response to the loss a few days ago.

“I told them before the season that the probability of us going 25-0 is zero,” Jackson said. “So, we need to go ahead and prepare ourselves now and think about how we’re going to respond if/when we do lose. And, for those who have never faced real adversity, they’re the leaders now. It showed in spurts today that we can be a really good team, we just have to be that for four quarters.”

Lamarius is the leading scorer for the Redskins averaging 24 points per outing. His twin brother, Quin Jackson and DaShon Hyman each average 15 points, too, to help lead the team to a 5-1 start to the season.

They’ve done so while going up against higher classification competition, too.

For instance, Morgan County is a Class AAA school. Social Circle beat Walnut Grove 73-70, which is a Class AAAA program not to mention defeating Class AAAAA M.L. King High School by nearly 30 points on Nov. 29.

This past weekend, the Redskins suffered a 52-51 loss to county rival Monroe Area at home. Then, going up against a Class AAAAAA program in Archer, Social Circle came up five points short, losing 57-52.

Social Circle’s upcoming schedule doesn’t get much easier, either.

This week, the Redskins will face Class AAAAAA Alcovy on the road on Dec. 20 and then

GHSA announces partnership with Falcons to host football state finals

ATLANTA — High school football teams across the Peach State who qualify for the state title games will play in the premiere sports venue in Georgia.

In a 2 p.m. press conference on Thursday, Dec. 15, GHSA Executive Director Dr. Robin Hines informed media members that the GHSA state championship football games are coming back to Mercedes-Benz Stadium.

The move includes hosting the girls flag football state championships beginning next year, too.

“As of now, we’re excited to be able to come back to Mercedes-Benz,” Hines said. “We absolutely enjoy a great relationship and partnership with the Falcons.”

“We’re here. The time is right. We’re grateful for them being able to work with us so that we can make this happen.”

This will be one of 50 events Mer-

cedes-Benz Stadium will host in a year, which includes the Corky Kell Classic — an annual series of high school football games played in Georgia at the beginning of each GHSA football season.

The venue also hosts Atlanta Falcons and Atlanta United home games throughout each team’s season.

The Georgia Bulldogs have a long history in Mercedes-Benz stadium, too.

In 2017 and 2022, they captured two SEC titles and, in a few days, Georgia will compete against Ohio State in the Chick-fil-a Peach Bowl — a bowl game that is part of the College Football Playoff.

The Georgia Tech Yellow Jackets are in the middle of a four-year deal to host a series of games called, “Mayhem in Mercedes.” That deal will expire in 2024 when Georgia Tech faces Notre Dame on Oct. 19, 2024. The Yellow Jackets enjoyed a 45-22 win over North

Carolina in 2021, which was the first edition of the event.

GHSA’s announcement comes four years after the GHSA made the move from Mercedes-Benz to Central Parc Stadium, which is the home of the Georgia State Panthers.

Hines recognized Georgia State’s connection to helping host the past 32 state title games across all eight classifications.

“I want to acknowledge what a great partner Georgia State has been,” Hines said. “[Georgia State] has really worked with us well and there will certainly be parts where we’ll be partnering with them in the future.”

The move to Central Parc Stadium, which was then named Georgia State Stadium, came after the Georgia Dome closed in 2017. Prior to that, the state title games were held at the Dome from 2008-2016. After two years at Mercedes-Benz, the GHSA moved to Georgia State.

'1923' offers another prelude to 'Yellowstone'

As it expands once more, the "Yellowstone" franchise is looking to the past ... again.

The new show's title offers sufficient proof. "1923" starts its run Sunday, Dec. 18, on Paramount+, with Harrison Ford (in his first continuing series part) and Oscar, Primetime Emmy and Tony winner Helen Mirren as Jacob and Cara Dutton, who head another division of the family that also is central to "Yellowstone" and its first prequel show, "1883." The relatives face such plights as illness and drought as they try to edge into then-modern times. The Taylor Sheridan-created series has a second season of eight episodes, the same length as Season 1, already ordered.

Being filmed principally in Montana, "1923" is "a wonderful adventure" in Mirren's view. "I'd never been to Montana before, so that's been a revelation," the actress says. "I knew it was impossibly beautiful, but the size and the variety of it is extraordinary. Doing this kind of story in this kind of landscape, where they are intrinsically tied together, is an amazing experience. The geography of America has always fascinated me, and these (characters) are dealing with all the glories and difficulties inherent in that."

The large cast of "1923" also includes James Badge Dale ("24") as John Dutton Sr., plus Timothy Dalton, Robert Patrick, Jennifer Ehle, Darren Mann ("Animal Kingdom"), Brandon

Sklenar ("Mapplethorpe"), Marley Shelton, Brian Geraghty ("Big Sky") and Jerome Flynn ("Game of Thrones"). Mirren reports that rather than being detailed about her role at the outset, creator-producer Sheridan gave her "a sense of, 'Do you want to come on this ride?' We don't know where the ride's going to take us, and I found that really interesting and exciting."

Mirren first worked with Ford in the 1986 movie "The Mosquito Coast." She recalls that as "a great time, then we went off and did other things and lived a whole life, really. There's been a connection that has never been lost, though ... so when we came together again, there was an incredible sense of familiarity and affection and history. That's invaluable if you're playing husband and wife."

Though Mirren won two of her Emmys for "Prime Suspect" mysteries, she doesn't consider those as series in the same way "1923" is.

"I've never done something like this before," she maintains. "With 'Prime Suspect,' we would do one four-hour story about every two years, so it was more like a miniseries. It wasn't something ongoing like this is, though how far we'll go is a mystery to me. I have to say that Taylor is an extraordinary writer; this springs with such complexity, but at the same time, it's incredibly accessible. It's not high-falutin', but very playable, great writing."

We both really love to work on historic homes, so they’re our preference. So we got to have a lot of fun and be really creative with this one. I think it was a good one. It was a really unique one.

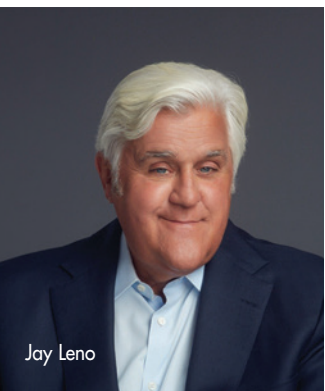
Get ready to see more (Moore?) of Mandy
