Abrams running for governor again

Democrat Stacey Abrams launched a long-anticipated bid for Georgia governor Wednesday, potentially pitting her in a rematch of her 2018 race against Republican Gov. Brian Kemp.

Abrams, a former Georgia House minority leader from Atlanta, posted a video Wednesday titled "One Georgia" pledging to work for all Georgians regardless of where they live.

"Opportunity in our state shouldn't be determined by your zip code, background or access to power," she

"If our Georgia is going to move to its next and greatest chapter, we're going to need leadership ... that knows how to do the job, leadership that doesn't take credit without also taking responsibility, that understands the pain folks are feeling and has real plans."

In a news release announcing her candidacy, Abrams accused Kemp of undermining Georgians' right to vote, failing to expand Medicaid, underfunding the state's education system and failing to show leadership during the coronavirus pan-

After losing to Kemp in a close race three years ago, Abrams founded the voting-rights group Fair Fight Action, which has helped her keep a high profile.

She was on the list of potential vice presidential nominees President Joe Biden considered last year before picking then-U.S. Sen. Kamala Harris of California for that role.

Abrams also has made a number of public appearances across the country, fueling speculation that she

might run for president. Abrams had been widely expected to challenge Kemp's bid for a second term in the

Governor's Mansion.

Kemp already faces a primary challenge from former state Rep. Vernon Jones, while there's been open speculation former U.S. Sen. David

Andre Dickens elected Atlanta mayor in runoff

Atlanta City Councilman Andre Dickens was elected the next mayor of Georgia's capital city Tuesday, easily defeating City Council President Felicia Moore in a runoff.

With 75% of the precincts reporting shortly after 11 p.m., Dickens led Moore 62% to 38%, according to unofficial results.

Dickens barely made the runoff, finishing well behind Moore in the regular election Nov. 2 and barely ahead of former Mayor

Kasim Reed. But Dickens' personable style on the campaign trail and an aggressive advertising push combined to put him over the top during the four-week runoff

race. Both candidates put addressing Atlanta's crime wave at the top of their list of priorities and pledged to unite a city torn by a push to create a separate city in Buckhead.

"This city needed a unifier, somebody that could bring this whole city together," Dickens told supporters in his victory speech. "Tonight, I am beyond humble that you have chosen me."

"One of the state's biggest weaknesses urban traffic congestion is being addressed by building a network of variably-priced managed lanes in metro Atlanta that could improve the state's traffic congestion in future reports."

In safety and performance categories, Georgia ranked 28th in overall fatality rate, seventh in structurally deficient bridges, 34th in traffic congestion, 16th in urban Interstate pavement condition, and 23rd in rural Interstate pavement condition.

Georgia spends \$66,994 per state-controlled mile of highway, 20th in total spending per mile and 19th in capital and bridge costs per mile.

Georgia's highways compare favorably to the neighboring states of Florida, Alabama and South Carolina but placed behind North Carolina and Tennes-

Georgia ranked high among the nation's most populous states, easily besting California, New York, Illinois and Florida, and ranking just ahead of Texas.

"To improve in the report's overall rankings, Georgia could reduce its urban fatality rate and urban traffic congestion," said Baruch Feigenbaum, the report's lead author and senior managing director of transportation policy at the Reason Foundation. "The state made progress reducing its administrative costs and improving rural arterial pavement quality leading to a 12-spot improvement in the rankings."

SOS pushing feds to disclose potential collusion on election law challenge

Georgia Secretary of State Brad Raffensperger has filed a lawsuit to prod the Justice Department into acting on a Freedom of Information (FOIA) request the state agency submitted last summer.

The request sought information on any communications the Biden administration may have had with prominent liberal groups concerning a Justice Department lawsuit challenging the election law reforms the General Assembly passed last March.

Other than confirmations of receipt, the state has received no response to the FOIA request.

"Considering how blatantly political the Biden lawsuit against Georgia's common-sense election law was from the beginning, it's no surprise they would stonewall our request for basic transparency," Raffensperger said Wednes-

The administration's lawsuit, filed in June, claimed Georgia's election reform law violated the federal Voting Rights Act by discriminating against Black voters.

Raffensperger's legal complaint charges the Justice Department stonewalling "is depriving plaintiffs and the public of vital information needed to determine the extent to which and by what methods the government is colluding or conspiring with outside entities to carry out a political agenda."

The complaint specifically names 62 outside individuals and entities, including Fair Fight Action, a voting rights group founded by Georgia gubernatorial candidate Stacey Abrams.

It also argues that states including Delaware, New York, Rhode Island, New Jersey, Maryland and Wisconsin have similar election rules yet are not being sued by the feds.



DeKalb County, is running for the Republican nomination for governor against incumbent

After he got an enthusiastic reception at the state GOP convention in July at Jekyll Island from Trump Harrumphs who had lustily booed Kemp, I wrote: "Vernon Jones? You've got to be kidding. This guy has more baggage than an airport carousel. Check his record. He is the quintessential RINO.'

To his credit, he contacted me minus the expected righteous indignation at my snarky comments and made his case for why he believes he would be the best candidate to face and defeat the probable Democrat nominee, Stacey Abrams. Among his list: "Let her try and play the race card with me," said Jones, who is Black.

This time he called because he has some ideas he wants to share with voters (that's you) and says the Atlanta media make a point of ignoring him and his ideas. I am happy to pass them along, this time without the snarky comments and to let you decide for yourself if they are worth your consideration. Besides, a lot of people who read this column ignore the Atlanta media. It works both ways.

In a nutshell, Jones wants to eliminate the state income tax which currently stands at 5.75% and believes he can accomplish that task in four years. The state income tax currently brings in some \$14 billion and at this point has created a \$3

billion surplus. He says, "Under President Donald Trump's pro-growth policies, our economy soared. The collection of increased sales taxes, property taxes, and income taxes that our state received allowed the Legislature to use a portion of that new revenue to eliminate the property tax and slightly lower the top income tax from 6% to 5.75%. But the key word here

is "portion." "In Fiscal Year 2021, our state received \$3.2 billion more in taxes than the year prior. Unfortunately, our state's spending also has soared. In Fiscal Year 2018, our state budget was \$25 billion. That has now increased to \$27.3 billion in Fiscal Year 2022. Rather

than spend the earnings

of our hardworking

the people of Georgia keep all their money? A small 'portion' just isn't enough." Jones says he would

residents, why not let

make Georgia like neighboring Tennessee and Florida – no state income tax states - and give that money back to the taxpayers.

"My solution to this growing problem is for the elected officials of Georgia to adopt a plan over a multiyear period that would allow us to compete with states that have no income tax," he told me." By keeping our state income tax, we are punishing people for bringing their families here. We are punishing them for choosing our state to launch their businesses. And we are punishing them financially for choosing our state rather than our competitors to begin the next chapter of their

So, how would he do it? "Everything is on the table," Jones said. "We can still maintain a surplus by cutting unnecessary spending." He is also looking at several sources of new income, including a two-cent increase in the state gasoline tax, which he says is among the lowest in the nation. (Actually, Georgia is 16th highest in the nation, according to Tax Foundation, a leading independent tax policy

Reader says community appearance demands action

A visitor to Covington who approached the town square via I-20 exit 90, Turner Lake Road and the west end of Clark Street would have to be forgiven for asking: Have we entered a third world country?

Hyperbole? Maybe so, but some days not so much.

The volume of trash and debris allowed to accumulate and remain for long stretches of time along many city streets and county roads gives the impres-

sion of a citizenry and local government that places too little value on the quality of life in the community. Meanwhile, we are being asked through local government surveys if we want an expanded public transportation infrastructure in the community. Would we prefer a skate park to a splash pool? How about a brewery vs. a new gymnasium and city center? Many interesting and positive choices are being dangled before us.

My suggestion: Let's

take care of the low hanging fruit first. Develop and execute a plan for keeping our streets, sidewalks and rights-of-way clean before we build new flashy, vote-getting amenities! How can we have confidence that these new community assets will be managed well when we don't even do a mediocre job of keeping the community clean?

I have the opportunity to travel in Georgia and other states and often remark that most communities seem to

have a handle on their litter problems. There is a stark contrast between most communities I visit and the Covington-Newton County area.

Businesses – especially big box stores and shopping centers – should routinely collect and dispose of trash on their property, especially parking lots.

Building contractors should provide and enforce the use of trash receptacles on their sites which would reduce litter that escapes from truck beds used for trash disposal.

The fines for littering should be doubled, enforced and frequently advertised. Recognize law enforcement for citing code violations.

We should plug into the state transportation department's new anti-litter program opportunities for businesses, organizations and individuals.

Some will blame the homeless community, a serious matter in Covington. If that's the case, solve the homelessness problem. Be intentional, make it a priority — get it done.

Why not assemble a coalition of city and county governments, Keep Covington Clean and Beautiful, the chamber of commerce, realtor groups, individuals, etc. — all of whom have a vested interest in an attractive community — to put ideas forward for tackling the litter and trash issues?

We are likely past the time when a sense of individual responsibility and community pride are going to change things. We need commitment from our elected officials, law enforcement, businesses and citizens to address the matter, not just on a one-time basis, but routinely.

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City leaders launch two-question 'quality of life' survey

Seeking input on future of Baker Field, Conyers Street Gym

COVINGTON, Ga. City leaders want residents' input on how to improve the community's quality of life and what to do with the Convers Street Gym and Baker Field.

The city of Covington recently launched a two question survey to garner a response from residents on the two issues at https://www. surveymonkey.com/r/

COV_QOL_Survey. Community Development Director Trey Sanders said more than 700 people had already taken the survey, as of Thursday afternoon, but that's only about 4.8% of the city's population

(14,598).

"As we look for ways to improve our community, it is imperative we get input from the people who might take advantage of those improvements or additions — our citizens. There are some exciting, costly items on that list and if city funds are going to be earmarked for the projects, we have to make sure the citizens sup-

port them and are they well received. I would hate to think anyone in this community feels like they don't have a voice, but here is an easy opportunity for everyone to share their opinion and help shape

our future." Sanders said a paper copy of the survey would be available at city hall, and people could fill it out there if they didn't have internet access or preferred that format over the online version.

Specifically, the first question asks survey participants to rank 14 different amenities from most important to least important. Those amenities include bike share program, skate park, splash park, aquatics center, brewery, public transportation, permanent lighting along Cricket Frog Trail, free putt-putt course, enhanced amphitheater and Legion Field to handle larger acts, golf cart charging stations, increased public art initiatives, local farmers market, open green space, and invest in infrastructure

to attract restaurants. The second question pertains to Baker Field and Convers Street Gym, asking survey participants to rank the following presences for the site from most desirable to least desir-

• "Restore/improve the field for use as a baseball field and restore the gym for use as a gymnasium."

• "Restore the field for use as a baseball field and rehab the gym for office/co-working

 "Create a mixed ise development that encompasses retail and housing on the field and gvm."

• "Restore the field and invest in infrastructure in the gym to attract various eateries (food hall)."

• "Restore Convers St. Gym by converting it into a Community Center and City Admin. Offices."

The redevelopment and renovation of Conyers Street Gym and Baker Field has been at the center of con-

and they've been successful in doing that, in my opinion.

"For a county our size and a (water and sewer) system our size, I think it's pretty amazing to have what we have," he

Serra Hall, executive director of the Newton County Industrial Development Authority (IDA), said she was "in frequent communication" with local utilities and other providers of basic services about what they have available as well as new infrastructure and upgrade plans "and even areas that are not available.'

"It's important to have an understanding and I'm grateful for the teams that work to make sure we are com-

municating effectively together," she said.

"It's a critical part of our office's job to have great relationships with our utility partners, both membership or privately owned or municipal based," Hall said.

She said Newton County and the IDA's regional partners "have tremendous utility assets."

"We have been blessed by hard-working individuals that are leaders in their respective fields," Hall said.

The Stanton Springs area includes the long-established Stanton Springs business park and the new Stanton Springs North park. The Joint Development Authority (JDA) of Jasper, Morgan, Newton and Walton counties developed and maintains them.

Stanton Springs already is home to Takeda Pharmaceuticals, Facebook Newton Data Center and Georgia's **BioScience Training** Center with a new project identified as Baymare also considering locating there.

The Georgia Environmental Finance Authority (GEFA) recently awarded a \$25 million Georgia Fund loan to NCWSA for construction of a new transmission main, water storage reservoir and upgrades to the Authority's water reclamation facility. The project is planned to serve future industrial and commercial demands at Stanton Springs.

Hopkins said cultivating good relationships with area governments has been critical to NCWSA's ability to serve new industries.

For example, NCW-SA has been "real fortunate" that it has worked

well with the Newton County government and Joint Development Authority on projects like service to Stanton Springs, he said.

He said the utility also worked through the IDA and Georgia Department of Economic Development to meet the needs of past projects — such as when the company that is now Takeda first considered locating in Stanton Springs.

Economic development agencies typically seek details about amounts of water and sewer capacity the NCWSA can provide in a certain area, Hopkins said.

"If you don't have the capacity or you don't have the flow, you can't tell somebody you can get it here when you can't, when you don't have the proper infrastructure," he said.

NCWSA officials know "what our infrastructure can and can't do," Hopkins said.

"We know what's in our capital improvement program and we go through those

'check boxes' that we go through internally, just making sure that we can deliver what's being requested," he

said. "A lot of times what happens is the deeper you get into the negotiations, you find out some truer numbers," he said. "Everybody up front is asking for a lot, or not knowing how much to ask."

The NCWSA typically does not like to approve projects whose costs would require increasing rates on existing customers, Hopkins said.

"Could there be something that comes up that we really struggle with? My board knows that we would not work in that direction," he said.

"But if we could do it as a benefit to the community, our board is willing for us to do all we can to make it happen," Hopkins said.

Stanton Springs North is partially in the city limits of Social Circle, which has multiple projects in the works like sidewalk enhancement and infrastructure upgrades, according to The Covington News' sister publication The Walton

Tribune. The city council is currently drafting a park use policy for the city's parks. Social Circle city officials also conducted public surveys and brought in a housing consultant this past spring to determine how to avoid sprawl while still allowing for growth, the Tribune reported.

In early November, Social Circle signed an amended Service Delivery Strategy agreement with the JDA for Stanton Springs and Stanton Springs North.

This allows the authority to select now and in the future services to include EMS, code enforcement, building inspections, economic development, police and fire protection, planning and zoning, natural gas, wastewater collection and treatment, and water supply and distribution, the Tribune reported

Hopkins said new industries opening in Newton County pay taxes which evens out the tax base and takes some of the burden for funding basic services off individual property

"Hopefully, it's providing for the economics of the county and just not (adding) more residential like we were in the early 2000s where it was all residential," Hopkins said. "It's more balanced now and that helps us all."

Covington man prime suspect in Gwinnett murder case




It got all the way to its respective basket and attempted a layup that hit the left side of the rim.



No. 1 Georgia braces for tough Tide in SEC Championship

ATHENS, Ga. — Should top-ranked Georgia face late-game stress against Alabama in the Southeastern Conference championship game on Saturday,

it will be a first for the Bulldogs. Georgia's 12-0 season has been free of anxiety. The Bulldogs never faced a second-half deficit in their proces-

sion of runaway wins. Fourth-quarter drama for Georgia's starters involved little more than staying out of the way of second- and third-string players running onto the field.

By contrast, Alabama (11-1), ranked No. 4 in the AP poll, has survived more late-game anxiety, including last week's 24-22 comeback win over Auburn in four overtimes.

If the SEC championship game is decided in the fourth quarter, players for Alabama will be able to draw on the experience of playing through other stressful games.

"I guess the benefit on that is just the experience that comes with it and being able to learn from it," Crimson Tide wide receiver John Metchie said Monday. "Being able to go back and see and just be more critical, more self critical and critique the games better tighter. And just just the more things to learn from."

If faced with their first late-game drama, Georgia players would have to rely on their practice for high-anxiety situations.

Bulldogs coach Kirby Smart insists the stress his staff creates for players in practice is sufficient preparation for real-game pressure. He said having his first-string offense and defense compete creates game-like stressful situations.

"Those are heatof-the-moment type plays," Smart told reporters on Monday.

"I know for a lot of you guys would say it's not the same as a game. It is. We make it like a game. You can only want to do it right so bad. If you won't do it

really right in practice, you're creating that same situation. A lot of our guys have played in the heat of the moment many times. I look at the start of every game that way."

Georgia's defense created the lopsided scores which led to the stress-free second halves. The Bulldogs led the nation by allowing only 83 points, or 6.9 per game.

No other defense was even close to Georgia's dominance. The nation's second-best scoring defense was Clemson with 180 points allowed, or 15 per game.

Georgia's average margin of victory in SEC games was 40-8.3. The Bulldogs trailed

only four times, including twice in a 41-17 win over Tennessee. The Vols were the only team to lead Georgia after the first quarter, and the Bulldogs responded to the second-quarter deficit by scoring 34 unanswered points.

Bulldogs quarterback Stetson Bennett says players won't be taking Alabama lightly just because they dominated other SEC teams.

"No, we have too much respect for who Alabama is this year as a team to allow ourselves to do that." Bennett said. "We're going to keep approaching this game like we have been every other game, and that's with the utmost respect for the opponent and to be able to execute our jobs to the best of our ability."

The win over Auburn, which led 10-0 through three quarters, was Alabama's most dramatic comeback. They also trailed Tennessee and LSU after the first quarter before winning

those games. "We just always preach to never give up," Alabama defensive end Phidarian Mathis said Monday, adding "everybody was bought in" when the Crimson

Tide trailed Auburn. "You could feel the energy on the sideline," Mathis said. "Nobody had their heads down, everybody had their chin up. You know, we was ready to go to war when we got into that situation. So I just feel like this team has grown a lot, and it shows how much everything means to us."
